1 SUBCHAPTER B. SYSTEM BOARD 2 Sec. 2.051. ESTABLISHMENT OF BOARD. The commissioner of education and the commissioner of higher education shall establish 3 4 a board to implement and administer the system. Sec. 2.052. MEMBERSHIP OF BOARD. (a) The board is composed 5 6 of 15 members, including the commissioner of education and the 7 commissioner of higher education. The commissioner of education 8 and the commissioner of higher education shall co-chair the board. (b) The commissioner of education shall appoint seven 9 members of the board. Five of the members appointed by the 10 commissioner of education must have extensive experience in the 11 12 field of public education data systems. Two of the members appointed by the commissioner of education must be selected from a 13 14 list of candidates prepared by the lieutenant governor for 15 appointment to the board. 16 (c) The commissioner of higher education shall appoint six 17 members of the board. Four of the members appointed by the commissioner of higher education must have extensive experience in 18 the field of higher education data systems. Two of the members 19 appointed by the commissioner of higher education must be selected 20 21 from a list of candidates prepared by the speaker of the house of representatives for appointment to the board. 22 Sec. 2.053. TERMS. Members of the board, other than the 23

25 <u>serve two-year terms expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered year,</u>

| 4 | Sec. 2.106. COMPARATIVE ACADEMIC AND FISCAL MEASURES OF |
| 5 | SUCCESS. (a) The board shall select a methodology and incorporate |
| 6 | into the system a capability for generating reports that compare |
| 7 | the spending and performance of educational institutions over time |
| 8 | and as compared with other educational institutions. |
| 9 | (b) The methodology selected by the board must include |
| 10 | advanced statistical methods that can adjust for factors beyond the |
| 11 | control of an educational institution, including student |
| 12 | demographics and community characteristics. |

13 <u>Sec. 2.107. DROPOUT PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION. (a) The</u> 14 <u>board shall contract with one or more centers for education</u> 15 <u>research, as established under Section 1.005, to develop</u> 16 <u>recommendations for establishing indicators for identifying</u> 17 <u>students who are likely to drop out of school.</u>

(b) The board shall select a methodology and incorporate
 into the system a reporting method that aids in the early detection
 and intervention of students who are likely to drop out of school.

21 <u>Sec. 2.108. INFORMATION CONCERNING INSTRUCTIONAL METHODS</u>
22 <u>PROHIBITED. The system may not contain any information concerning</u>
23 <u>instructional methods, except as required by federal law.</u>

7 (2) the speaker of the house of representatives shall 8 provide the commissioner of higher education with a list of 9 candidates for appointment to the Texas Education Data System 10 (TEDS) board, as required by Section 2.052, Education Code, as 11 added by this Act; and

12 (3) the commissioner of education and the commissioner 13 of higher education shall appoint members to the Texas Education 14 Data System (TEDS) board.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
