        issue in a prior decision made by the attorney general under this

            (1) a suit challenging the prior decision was timely
        filed against the attorney general in accordance with this chapter
        concerning the precise information at issue;
            (2) the attorney general determines that the requestor
        has voluntarily withdrawn the request for the information in
        writing or has abandoned the request; and
