Section 1304.003, Occupations Code, is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to read as 1-13 1**-**14 1**-**15 follows: In this chapter, "service contract" means an agreement: (a) 1-16 (1) that is entered into for a separately stated 1-17 consideration and for a specified term; and 1-18 (2) under which a provider agrees to repair, replace, or maintain a product, or provide indemnification for the repair, replacement, or maintenance of a product, for operational or structural failure or damage caused by a defect in materials or 1-19 1-20 1-21 1-22 workmanship or by normal wear.
