A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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1	AN ACT
2	relating to grants for school-based health centers.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Sections 38.063(a), (b), (d), (e), (f), and (g),
5	Education Code, are amended to read as follows:
6	(a) Subject to the availability of federal or state
7	appropriated funds, the commissioner of <u>state</u> [public] health
8	services shall administer a program under which grants are awarded
9	to assist school districts and nonprofit organizations or
10	governmental entities that collaborate with school districts with
11	the costs of [operating] school-based health centers in accordance
12	with this section.
13	(b) The commissioner of $\underline{\text{state}}$ [$\underline{\text{public}}$] health $\underline{\text{services}}$, by
14	rules adopted in accordance with this section, shall establish

- rules adopted in accordance with this section, shall establish procedures for awarding grants. The rules must provide that:
- (1) grants are awarded <u>annually</u> [to school districts 16 17 on an annual basis] through a competitive process to:
- (A) school districts; and 18
- 19 (B) nonprofit organizations or governmental entities that collaborate with school districts to establish and 20 21 operate school-based health centers; and
- (2) a preference is given to <u>school-based health</u> 22 23 centers in school districts that are located in rural areas or that 24 have low property wealth per student.

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- 1 (d) A school district, nonprofit organization, or 2 governmental entity may not receive more than \$250,000 per state 3 fiscal biennium through grants awarded under this section.
- 4 To be eligible to receive a grant, a school district, 5 nonprofit organization, or governmental entity must provide 6 matching funds in accordance with rules adopted under Subsection (b). The matching funds may be obtained from any source available to 7 8 the district, nonprofit organization, or governmental entity, including in-kind contributions, community or foundation grants, 9 individual contributions, and local governmental agency operating 10 funds. 11
- 12 (f) The commissioner of state [public] health services
 13 shall adopt rules establishing standards for health care centers
 14 funded through grants that place primary emphasis on delivery of
 15 health services and secondary emphasis on population-based models
 16 that prevent emerging health threats.
- 17 (g) The commissioner of state [public] health services
 18 shall require client surveys to be conducted in school-based health
 19 centers funded through grants awarded under this section, and the
 20 results of those surveys must be included in the annual report
 21 required under Section 38.064.
- 22 SECTION 2. Section 38.064, Education Code, is amended to 23 read as follows:
- Sec. 38.064. REPORT TO LEGISLATURE. (a) Based on statistics obtained from <u>each</u> [every] school-based health center that receives a grant under Section 38.063 [in this state], the commissioner of state [public] health services shall issue an

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- 1 annual report to the legislature about the relative efficacy of
- 2 services delivered by school-based health centers that receive
- 3 state grants and any increased academic success of students at
- 4 campuses served by those centers, with special emphasis on any:
- 5 (1) increased attendance;

Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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- 6 (2) [decreased drop-out rates;
- 7 $\left[\frac{(3)}{3}\right]$ improved student health; and
- 8 (3) [(4)] improved performance on student assessment 9 instruments administered under Subchapter B, Chapter 39.
- 10 (b) In obtaining statistics for preparation of the report
 11 required by this section, the commissioner of state [public] health
 12 services shall ensure that data is collected [for each county] and

aggregated appropriately according to geographical region.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
