- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 392, Finance Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 392.307 to read as follows:
- Sec. 392.307. CONTACTING PERSON OTHER THAN CONSUMER. (a)
 8 In this section, "location information" means a person's place of
- 9 permanent or temporary residence, telephone number, or place of
- 10 employment.

- 11 (b) A debt collector may contact a person regarding a debt,
- other than the consumer who has the debt or person with whom the
- debt collector has a business relationship for the purpose of debt
- 14 collection, only for the purpose of determining the location
- information of the debtor.
- 16 (c) A debt collector may not contact a person, other than
- the consumer who has the debt or person with whom the debt collector
- 18 has a business relationship for the purpose of debt collection, as
- 19 provided by Subsection (b) more than once, unless the debt
- 20 <u>collector is able to produce evidence that:</u>
- 21 (1) was not available at the time the debt collector

- 1 the person now has correct or complete location information for the
- 2 debtor.
- 3 (d) A debt collector who violates this section is liable to
- 4 this state for a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed \$150 for
- 5 <u>each violation</u>. The attorney general may bring an action to recover
- 6 a civil penalty under this subsection.
- 7 <u>(e) The attorney general has exclusive authority to enforce</u>
- 8 this section. Sections 392.402 and 392.403, and Section 392.404 to
- 9 the extent that section creates a private right of action, do not
- 10 apply to a violation of this section.
- 11 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
