4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 21.657(a), Education Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	(a) An eligible campus must use 25 percent of a grant award
8	received under Section 21.655 to provide for:
9	(1) incentive payments to campus employees other than
10	classroom teachers, such as principals, assistant principals,
11	teachers who are not eligible for an incentive payment under
12	Section 21.656, counselors, speech therapists, instructional
13	coaches, teacher's aides, nurses, librarians, members of the
14	custodial staff, or other campus employees who have contributed to
15	<pre>improved student achievement;</pre>
16	(2) professional development for classroom teachers
17	who:
18	(A) do not receive an incentive payment under
19	Section 21.656; and
20	(B) would benefit from professional development
21	to develop or enhance skills and behaviors described under Section
22	21.656(b);
23	(3) reimbursement or funding for a professional
24	development activity that directly contributes to improved

classroom instruction and student achievement; 1 signing bonuses for classroom teachers new to the 2 (4) campus who are teaching subjects that have been designated by the 3 commissioner as historically experiencing a critical shortage of 4 5 teachers; (5) a teacher mentoring program that meets the 6 7 requirements of Section 21.458; 8 (6) an activity that supports new teacher induction 9 programs, including: 10 (A) common planning time and collaboration; a professional development activity; and 11 (B) standards-based evaluations; 12 (C) (7) an activity that supports common planning time and 13 14 curriculum development; 15 (8) a program that has been proven to recruit and retain highly effective teachers, including a teacher retention 16 17 demonstration project that employs innovative, research-based practices to identify and retain highly effective teachers, such 18 19 as: (A) a teacher recruitment and selection strategy 20 21 focused on attracting new and experienced teachers who have deep content knowledge and a commitment to long-term participation in 22 the teaching profession; 23 24 (B) an alternative certification program that prepares individuals who have deep content knowledge and 25 outstanding academic or professional achievement for long-term 26 participation in the teaching profession; 27

1 (C) a campus governance model that engages 2 teachers in leading campus management activities, including student assessment data analysis, professional development 3 planning, instructional coaching, and resource allocation; 4 5 (D) a differentiated compensation plan that 6 addresses teaching shortages in specific subject areas, instructional weaknesses at underperforming campuses, limited 7 advanced academic course offerings, or other critical needs 8 identified by the district; or 9 10 (E) another research-based strategy designed to improve teacher retention rates; 11 an activity that creates or furthers the goals of 12 (9) an incentive system designed to improve student achievement; 13 14 (10)stipends for teachers who participate in an 15 after-school or Saturday program that directly contributes to improved classroom instruction and student achievement; 16 17 (11)stipends for teachers who are certified under Subchapter B in the main subject area in which they teach; 18 19 (12) stipends for teachers who hold a postgraduate degree; 20 additional funding for feeder campuses that, 21 (13)because they are not assigned performance ratings under Chapter 39, 22 do not qualify to participate in the program, such as campuses that 23 24 serve kindergarten through grade two, to implement an activity described by this section; and 25 (14) any other program that directly contributes to 26 27 improved student achievement.

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H.B. No. 2399 1 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2007-2008 2 school year.

3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
