- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter J, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 21.460 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 21.460. TEACHER RETENTION DEMONSTRATION PROJECTS.
- 8 (a) From funds appropriated to the agency for purposes of this
- 9 section, the commissioner may provide grants to school districts to
- 10 design and implement teacher retention demonstration projects that
- 11 employ innovative, research-based practices to identify and retain
- 12 highly effective teachers.
- (b) A school district may use funds received under this
- 14 section to:

- 15 (1) implement teacher recruitment and selection
- 16 strategies focused on attracting new and experienced teachers who
- 17 have deep content knowledge and a commitment to long-term
- 18 participation in the teaching profession;
- 19 <u>(2) implement alternative certification programs that</u>
- 20 prepare individuals who have deep content knowledge and outstanding
- 21 academic or professional achievement for long-term participation
- 22 in the teaching profession;
- 23 (3) implement induction and mentoring programs that
- 24 incorporate research-based practices, including common planning

- 1 times and collaboration among new and experienced teachers;
- 2 (4) implement campus governance models that engage
- 3 <u>teachers</u> in <u>leading</u> campus management activities, including
- 4 student assessment data analysis, professional development
- 5 planning, instructional coaching, and resource allocation;
- 6 (5) implement differentiated compensation plans that
- 7 address teaching shortages in specific subject areas,
- 8 <u>instructional weaknesses at underperforming campuses</u>, limited
- 9 advanced academic course offerings, or other critical needs
- 10 <u>identified by the district; or</u>
- 11 (6) to the extent approved by the commissioner,
- 12 implement other research-based strategies designed to improve
- 13 teacher retention rates.
- 14 (c) The commissioner shall develop and implement an
- 15 evaluation plan to identify the teacher retention demonstration
- 16 projects most effective in increasing the retention of effective
- 17 teachers. The evaluation must include an analysis of the
- 18 relationship between specific teacher preparation models and
- 19 teacher effectiveness and retention. The commissioner shall
- 20 <u>disseminate evaluation findings through a statewide communication</u>
- 21 <u>initiative</u>.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2007-2008
- 23 school year.
- 24 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
