H.B. No. 2400

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

1
2 relating to membership in, contributions to, benefits from, and
3 administration of the Texas Emergency Services Retirement System;
4 providing a penalty.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Chapter 861, Government Code, is amended by
7 adding Sections 861.008 and 861.009 to read as follows:

8 Sec. 861.008. IMMUNITY FROM LIABILITY. The state board,
9 commissioner, and employees of the pension system are not liable
10 for any action taken or omission made or suffered by them in good
11 faith in the performance of any duty or prerogative in connection
12 with the administration of the pension system.

13 Sec. 861.009. VENUE. An action in state court by or against
14 the pension system shall be brought in Travis County.

15 SECTION 2. Section 862.002(a), Government Code, is amended
16 to read as follows:

17 (a) Except as otherwise provided by this section and Section
18 862.0021, each person who performs service as a volunteer or
19 auxiliary employee of a participating department is a member of the
20 pension system.

21 SECTION 3. Chapter 862, Government Code, is amended by
22 adding Section 862.0021 to read as follows:

23 Sec. 862.0021. PROBATIONARY PERIOD BEFORE MEMBERSHIP. (a)
24 A participating department may impose a probationary period for a

1 volunteer or auxiliary employee.

2 (b) A probationary period imposed under this section must
3 end not later than six months after the date the person begins
4 service with the participating department.

5 (c) The participating department is not required to pay
6 contributions for the person during the probationary period.

7 (d) A person's membership in the pension system begins on
8 the date that the department begins payment of contributions for
9 that person, without regard to whether the person's service is
10 subject to a probationary period for other purposes.

11 SECTION 4. Sections 864.004 and 864.005, Government Code,
12 are amended to read as follows:

13 Sec. 864.004. DISABILITY RETIREMENT BENEFITS [~~ANNUITY~~].

14 (a) A member is entitled to disability retirement benefits from the
15 pension system only if a local board determines that the member
16 became disabled during the performance of emergency service duties
17 and is unable to return to work at the member's regular occupation
18 or, if the member is a student, is unable to return to the member's
19 scholastic studies. A disabled member must, at the time of
20 disability, elect between a service [~~or disability~~] retirement
21 annuity or disability retirement benefits, if eligible for both.

22 (b) A disabled member described by Subsection (a) who does
23 not elect to receive a service retirement annuity is entitled to
24 [~~who is disabled during the performance of emergency service duties~~
25 is automatically vested 100 percent as of the date of disability if
26 the disability occurs before the member has completed the period
27 provided under Section 864.001 for full service retirement

1 ~~benefits.~~

2 ~~[(c) A member whose disability results from performing~~
3 ~~emergency service duties is guaranteed a]~~ disability retirement
4 benefits [~~annuity~~] of \$300 a month or a greater amount that the
5 state board by rule adopts based on monthly contributions of a
6 participating department for its members.

7 (c) To continue to receive disability retirement benefits
8 in the form of a continuing annuity, computed in the manner
9 described by Subsection (b), a [~~(d) A~~] person who is determined by
10 a local board to be temporarily disabled must:

11 (1) apply to the medical board appointed by the state
12 board; [~~Social Security Administration~~] and

13 (2) [be certified, not later than the first [~~second~~]
14 anniversary of the date the person was determined to be temporarily
15 disabled, be certified by the medical board as permanently disabled
16 for the performance of the duties of the person's regular
17 occupation [~~by that agency or by any alternative procedure the~~
18 ~~state board provides by rule~~].

19 Sec. 864.005. CERTIFICATION AND CONTINUANCE OF
20 DISABILITY. (a) A local board shall require a member who is
21 receiving temporary disability benefits to file a disability rating
22 report every three months from a physician chosen by the local
23 board. If a report indicates a significant improvement in [~~change~~
24 ~~of~~] condition, the local board, after notice and a hearing, may
25 adopt an order to terminate payments [~~or place the member on~~
26 ~~permanent disability~~]. The local board shall send a copy of each
27 order adopted under this subsection to the commissioner.

1 (b) Temporary disability [~~Disability~~] benefits cease if the
2 recipient returns to work at the person's regular occupation,
3 resumes scholastic studies, or performs emergency service duties
4 for any agency, or if the local board adopts an order under
5 Subsection (a).

6 (c) Subject to Subsection (d), temporary disability
7 benefits cease on a date at the expiration of a period, not to
8 exceed one year, determined to be the likely duration of the
9 disability by a physician in a written statement to the pension
10 system.

11 (d) If the local board has reason to believe that a ground
12 for termination of temporary disability benefits exists, the local
13 board may set a date for a hearing on the matter. The local board,
14 after notice and a hearing, may adopt an order terminating
15 temporary disability benefits if the local board determines that a
16 ground for termination exists. The local board may not adopt an
17 order under this subsection on the basis of a physician's
18 previously submitted statement as to the likely duration of the
19 disability if the local board determines, after a hearing, that the
20 disability continues. The local board shall send a copy of each
21 order adopted under this subsection to the commissioner.

22 (e) Payments of a continuing disability retirement annuity
23 to a retiree certified by the medical board as permanently disabled
24 under Section 864.004(c) cease if the retiree returns to work at the
25 retiree's regular employment or performs emergency service duties.

26 (f) If the commissioner has reason to believe that a ground
27 for termination of a continuing disability retirement annuity

1 exists, the commissioner shall set a date for a hearing on
2 continuation or termination of the annuity. The commissioner,
3 after notice and a hearing, shall adopt an order terminating the
4 continuing disability retirement annuity if the commissioner
5 determines that a ground for termination exists.

6 (g) Except as provided by this subsection, a continuing
7 disability retirement annuity terminates on the fifth anniversary
8 of the date payment of the annuity begins. To continue receiving
9 payments of a continuing disability retirement annuity after the
10 fifth anniversary, the retiree must be recertified by the medical
11 board as being permanently disabled for the performance of [~~becomes~~
12 ~~capable of performing the duties of the person's most recent~~
13 ~~position with a participating department or]~~ the duties of any
14 [~~another~~] occupation for which the person is reasonably suited by
15 education, training, and experience and that could reasonably be
16 expected to provide the person with at least 75 percent of the
17 salary the person was earning at the time the disability occurred.
18 Rejection of a suitable offer of employment as described in this
19 subsection is conclusive evidence for purposes of this subtitle
20 that the person is no longer eligible to receive disability
21 retirement benefits[~~, if the employment would provide the person~~
22 ~~with a salary equal to or greater than the salary the person was~~
23 ~~earning at the time the disability occurred].~~

24 (h) [~~(e)~~] The state board or a local board may require
25 financial information from a person as a condition to the continued
26 receipt of disability retirement benefits, including federal
27 income tax returns and wage earning forms. Failure to timely

1 provide requested information is a ground for terminating benefits.

2 SECTION 5. Section 864.006(a), Government Code, is amended
3 to read as follows:

4 (a) The surviving spouse and dependents of a member who dies
5 as a result of performing emergency service duties are entitled to
6 receive in equal shares a death benefit annuity equal to
7 ~~[two-thirds of]~~ the service retirement annuity that the decedent
8 would have been entitled to receive if the decedent had been able to
9 retire, vested at 100 percent, on the date of the decedent's death.
10 ~~[As long as both the spouse and one or more dependents survive, an~~
11 ~~additional one-third of that annuity is payable to the dependents~~
12 ~~in equal shares.]~~

13 SECTION 6. Sections 864.007, 864.008, and 864.011,
14 Government Code, are amended to read as follows:

15 Sec. 864.007. MEMBER NONSERVICE DEATH BENEFIT. The state
16 board by rule may provide the beneficiary of a deceased member whose
17 death did not result from the performance of emergency service
18 duties a ~~[lump-sum]~~ benefit, which may be a lump-sum amount or an
19 annuity ~~[that is the greater of:~~

20 ~~(1) the amount contributed to the fund on the~~
21 ~~decedent's behalf; or~~

22 ~~(2) the sum that would have been contributed on the~~
23 ~~decedent's behalf from whatever source at the end of the period~~
24 ~~provided under Section 864.001 for full service retirement~~
25 ~~benefits].~~

26 Sec. 864.008. VESTED MEMBER DEATH BENEFIT ANNUITY. (a)
27 The state board by rule may provide that the surviving spouse of a

1 deceased member who dies as an active member of a participating
2 department before retirement but after meeting the minimum age and
3 service requirements for service retirement is entitled to a
4 portion [~~two-thirds~~] of the monthly annuity that the decedent would
5 have received if the decedent had retired on the date of death.

6 (b) The state board by rule may provide that the surviving
7 spouse of a deceased member who dies after terminating service with
8 all participating departments and meeting a service [~~vesting~~]
9 requirement under Section 864.001 but before attaining the age of
10 55 is entitled to a death benefit annuity, in an amount to be
11 determined by rule, beginning on the date that is the later of:

12 (1) the date that the decedent would have attained
13 that age; or

14 (2) the date of application for the annuity [~~, equal to~~
15 ~~two-thirds of the monthly annuity to which the decedent would have~~
16 ~~been entitled on that date]~~.

17 (c) A rule adopted under Subsection (b) may not authorize
18 payment for a period before the date specified by that subsection.

19 Sec. 864.011. FIRST PAYMENT OF RETIREMENT OR DEATH BENEFIT
20 ANNUITY. The cashing or depositing of the first payment of a
21 service retirement annuity, disability retirement annuity, or
22 death benefit annuity by a person entitled to it, or the receipt by
23 a financial institution for credit to that person's account of a
24 transfer of funds by the pension system through electronic means,
25 is considered acceptance of the amount of the annuity and of the
26 amount of service of the person on whose service the annuity is
27 based [~~, if the annuity is based on the payee's service, is~~

1 ~~conclusive evidence for purposes of this subtitle that the payee is~~
2 ~~retired].~~

3 SECTION 7. Chapter 864, Government Code, is amended by
4 adding Section 864.0135 to read as follows:

5 Sec. 864.0135. OPTIONAL ANNUITY INCREASE OR SUPPLEMENTAL
6 PAYMENTS. (a) The state board by rule may authorize a
7 participating department to:

8 (1) make one or more supplemental payments to retirees
9 and other beneficiaries of the pension system; or

10 (2) provide an increase in the amount of annuities
11 paid to retirees and other beneficiaries of the pension system.

12 (b) A participating department that elects an option under a
13 rule adopted under this section shall fund all increased benefits
14 that are provided to retirees and other beneficiaries of the
15 department under the option.

16 SECTION 8. Sections 864.016(a), (c), and (d), Government
17 Code, are amended to read as follows:

18 (a) A claim for disability retirement benefits or a lump-sum
19 death benefit must be filed with the local board. A claim for
20 service retirement benefits must be filed with the commissioner,
21 who shall forward the claim to the appropriate local board for a
22 hearing. A claim for a death benefit annuity must be filed with the
23 commissioner, who shall make a determination of the merits of the
24 claim and issue a decision to the claimant. On receiving a claim
25 under this section, the local board shall hold a hearing to decide
26 the claim. The local board shall send a written copy of its
27 decision to the claimant and the commissioner. If a local board

1 does not determine a claim for service retirement benefits and file
2 its determination with the commissioner before the 16th day after
3 the date the local board receives the claim, the commissioner may
4 determine the merits of the claim.

5 (c) An appeal of a local board decision under this section
6 is begun by delivering a notice of appeal to the presiding officer
7 or secretary of the local board that made the decision. The notice
8 must be delivered not later than the 20th day after the date of the
9 decision and contain a brief description of the reasons for the
10 appeal. The aggrieved person must file a copy of the notice with
11 the commissioner.

12 (d) An appeal of a local board decision under this section
13 is held in Austin and is a contested case under Chapter 2001,
14 conducted as a de novo hearing by the State Office of Administrative
15 Hearings.

16 SECTION 9. Section 865.010(c), Government Code, is amended
17 to read as follows:

18 (c) The commissioner may request and administer [~~in an~~
19 ~~emergency,~~] state funds appropriated by the legislature in addition
20 to those required by this subtitle [~~and appropriated by the~~
21 ~~legislature~~].

22 SECTION 10. Section 864.015, Government Code, is repealed.

23 SECTION 11. (a) The change in law made by this Act to
24 Sections 864.004 and 864.005, Government Code, does not apply to a
25 person who, on the effective date of this Act, is receiving
26 permanent disability retirement benefits under those sections as
27 they existed immediately before amendment by this Act, and the

1 prior law is continued in effect for this purpose.

2 (b) A person who, on the effective date of this Act, is
3 receiving temporary disability benefits under Section 864.004,
4 Government Code, as that section existed immediately before
5 amendment by this Act, is entitled to receive temporary disability
6 benefits in accordance with a certification made before the
7 effective date of this Act. To continue to receive disability
8 retirement benefits after September 1, 2008, the person must be
9 certified, before September 1, 2008, as permanently disabled as
10 provided by Section 864.005, Government Code, as amended by this
11 Act, and is subject to the recertification requirement of that
12 section.

13 SECTION 12. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
