	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to the licensing and regulation of the practice of
3	dietetics and nutrition care services.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 701.001, Occupations Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	Sec. 701.001. SHORT TITLE. This chapter may be cited as the
8	<u>Texas Dietetics and Nutrition Practice</u> [Licensed Dietitian] Act.
9	SECTION 2. Section 701.002, Occupations Code, is amended by
10	amending Subdivisions (3), (4), (6), and (8) and adding Subdivision
11	(7-a) to read as follows:
12	(3) "Dietetics <u>and nutrition care services</u> " means the
13	integration and application of [professional discipline of
14	applying and integrating] scientific principles of food,
15	nutrition, biochemistry, physiology, management, and behavioral
16	and social sciences [under different health, social, cultural,
17	physical, psychological, and economic conditions for the proper
18	nourishment, care, and education of an individual or group
19	throughout the life cycle] to achieve, [and] maintain, and restore
20	human health[. The term includes the development, management, and
21	provision of nutrition services].
22	(4) "Dietitians board" means the Texas [State] Board
23	of <u>Dietetics and Nutrition</u> [Examiners of Dietitians].
24	(6) "Nutrition <u>care systems</u> [assessment]" means <u>all of</u>

the services provided by a licensed dietitian in each area of 1 2 practice, including assessment, evaluation, counseling, monitoring, consultation, food preparation and delivery, research, 3 4 nutrition therapy, and education [evaluating the nutritional needs of an individual or group based on appropriate biochemical, 5 6 anthropometric, physical, and dietary data to determine nutrient 7 needs and recommend appropriate nutritional intake, including 8 enteral and parenteral nutrition]. 9 (7-a) "Nutrition therapy" means the management of a disease or condition through the modification of nutrient or 10 whole-food intake. The term encompasses the assessment of an 11 12 individual's nutrition status, evaluation of nutritional needs, and intervention or counseling to achieve optimal clinical 13 outcomes, taking into consideration the individual's health care 14 15 and dietary histories and physical, anthropometric, and laboratory data. The term includes oral, enteral, and parenteral nutrition 16 interventions and takes into consideration the cultural 17 background, socioeconomic status, and food preferences of the 18 19 individual. (8) "Practice of dietetics and nutrition care 20 [<u>"Nutrition</u>] services" <u>includes</u> [means]: 21 (A) assessing the nutritional needs of 22 an group based on biochemical, anthropometric, 23 individual or 24 physical, and dietary data, [and] determining constraints and resources to meet the nutritional needs of the individual or group, 25 26 and recommending proper nutrition intervention to satisfy those needs, including oral, enteral, and parenteral nutrition 27

2	(B) establishing priorities, objectives, and
3	goals that meet the nutritional needs of the individual or group
4	based on [and are consistent with] constraints and available
5	resources;
6	(C) providing nutrition <u>education or</u> counseling
7	in health and disease;
8	(D) developing, implementing, and managing <u>a</u>
9	<pre>nutrition [nutritional] care system [systems]; [or]</pre>
10	(E) evaluating, <u>adjusting</u> [changing], and
11	maintaining appropriate quality standards in <u>dietetics</u> [food] and
12	nutrition [nutritional] care services; and
13	(F) providing nutrition therapy.
14	SECTION 3. Section 701.003, Occupations Code, is amended to
15	read as follows:
16	Sec. 701.003. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The Texas [State]
17	Board of Dietetics and Nutrition [Examiners of Dietitians] is
18	subject to Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless
19	continued in existence as provided by that chapter, the board is
20	abolished September 1, 2017.
21	SECTION 4. Subchapter A, Chapter 701, Occupations Code, is
22	amended by adding Section 701.004 to read as follows:
23	Sec. 701.004. APPLICATION OF CHAPTER. (a) This chapter
24	does not apply to a person who does not violate Section 701.251(b)
25	or (c) and is:
26	(1) a retailer that furnishes free oral or written
27	general nutrition information to a customer on food, food

materials, dietary supplements, and other goods sold at the 1 2 retailer's establishment in connection with the marketing and distribution of those goods at the retailer's establishment, if the 3 4 information does not violate Section 101.201; (2) a person that furnishes free oral or written 5 6 nutrition information on food, food materials, or dietary supplements, if the information does not violate Section 101.201; 7 8 (3) a person engaged in the practice of the tenets of any religion, sect, or denomination; 9 (4) a person who freely disseminates information, 10 conducts a class or seminar, or gives a speech related to dietetics 11 12 and nutrition care services, if the person does not violate Section 101.201; 13 (5) a licensed health care professional practicing 14 15 within the authorized scope of the person's license; 16 (6) a student or trainee working under the direct supervision of a licensed dietitian for a limited period as 17 determined by the dietitians board, while fulfilling an experience 18 19 requirement or pursuing a course of study to meet requirements for a license under this chapter; 20 (7) a person assisting in the practice of dietetics 21 and nutrition care services under the direct supervision of a 22 licensed dietitian and performing only support activities; or 23 24 (8) a person providing a program of weight control services if the program has been reviewed by, consultation is 25 26 available from, and no program change can be initiated without 27 prior approval of:

No. 2419 1 (A) a licensed dietitian; 2 (B) a dietitian licensed in another state that has licensing requirements that are at least as stringent as the 3 requirements under this chapter; 4 5 (C) a dietitian registered by the Commission on 6 Dietet<u>ic Registration; or</u> 7 (D) a licensed physician. 8 (b) This chapter does not apply to a dietitian or 9 nutritionist serving in the United States armed forces or the United States Public Health Service or employed by the Department 10 of Veterans Affairs when performing duties associated with that 11 12 service or employment. (c) This chapter does not apply to a dietitian or 13 14 nutritionist employed by the state or a political subdivision of 15 this state, including a school district, who is acting solely within the scope of the person's employment. 16 17 (d) This chapter does not authorize a person to make a medical diagnosis or otherwise engage in the practice of medicine 18 19 in violation of Subtitle B. SECTION 5. The heading to Subchapter B, Chapter 701, 20 21 Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: SUBCHAPTER B. TEXAS [STATE] BOARD OF DIETETICS AND NUTRITION 22 [EXAMINERS OF DIETITIANS] 23 24 SECTION 6. The heading to Section 701.051, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 25 Sec. 701.051. [DIETITIANS] BOARD MEMBERSHIP. 26 27 SECTION 7. Section 701.051(a), Occupations Code, is amended

1 to read as follows: 2 (a) The Texas [State] Board of Dietetics and Nutrition [Examiners of Dietitians] consists of nine members appointed by the 3 governor with the advice and consent of the senate as follows: 4 (1) six licensed dietitian members, each of whom has 5 6 been licensed under this chapter for not less than three years before the member's date of appointment; and 7 8 (2) three members who represent the public. 9 SECTION 8. Section 701.251(b), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 10 (b) Unless the person holds <u>a</u> [an appropriate] license 11 12 issued under this chapter, a person may not: (1) use the title or represent or imply that the person 13 has the title "dietitian," "licensed dietitian," "licensed 14 dietitian and nutritionist," "nutritionist," "nutrition 15 therapist," or "licensed nutritionist" or ["provisional licensed 16 dietitian" or] use the letters "LD," "LDN," "LNT," or "LN" [or 17 <u>"PLD"</u>]; [or] 18 (2) use a facsimile of those titles to indicate or 19 imply that the person is a <u>dietitian</u>, licensed dietitian, licensed 20 21 dietitian and nutritionist, nutritionist, nutrition therapist, or licensed nutritionist [or provisional licensed dietitian]; or 22 (3) engage in the practice of dietetics and nutrition 23 24 care services for compensation. SECTION 9. Section 701.252(a), Occupations Code, is amended 25 26 to read as follows:

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(a) Each applicant for a [dietitian] license under this

H.B. No. 2419 1 chapter must submit a sworn application accompanied by the 2 application fee. Section 701.253(f), Occupations 3 SECTION 10. Code, is 4 amended to read as follows: 5 (f) The dietitians board shall waive the examination 6 requirement for an applicant who, at the time of application, is a 7 dietitian registered by the Commission on Dietetic Registration. 8 An applicant under this section is entitled to obtain a license if 9 the applicant: 10 (1) submits an application under Section 701.252; (2) passes the jurisprudence examination required by 11 12 Section 701.2575; and (3) pays the required examination and license fees. 13 14 SECTION 11. Section 701.254, Occupations Code, is amended 15 to read as follows: QUALIFICATIONS FOR EXAMINATION. To qualify Sec. 701.254. 16 17 for the licensing examination under this chapter, an applicant must: 18 possess a baccalaureate or postbaccalaureate 19 (1)degree, conferred by a college or university regionally accredited 20 at the time of conferral, with: 21 a major course of study in human nutrition, 22 (A) food and nutrition, nutrition education, dietetics, nutrition 23 24 science, or food systems management accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Dietetics Education; or 25 an equivalent major course of study approved 26 (B) 27 by the dietitians board; and

1	(2) have completed an internship or <u>supervised</u>
2	practice accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for
3	Dietetics Education or a preplanned, documented, professional
4	experience program in dietetics practice of not less than 900 hours
5	under the supervision of a licensed dietitian or a registered
6	dietitian approved by the board.
7	SECTION 12. Section 701.258, Occupations Code, is amended
8	to read as follows:
9	Sec. 701.258. QUALIFIED PERSON ENTITLED TO LICENSE. <u>(a)</u>
10	The dietitians board shall issue a license certificate as a
11	licensed dietitian to a person qualified for a license under this
12	chapter.
13	(b) A person holding a license certificate issued under this
14	chapter may use any title or letters described in Section
15	<u>701.251(b)(1).</u>
16	SECTION 13. Subchapter H, Chapter 701, Occupations Code, is
17	amended by adding Section 701.354 to read as follows:
18	Sec. 701.354. REIMBURSEMENT NOT MANDATED; SERVICES
19	AUTHORIZED. (a) This chapter does not require new or additional
20	third-party reimbursement or mandated workers' compensation
21	benefits for services provided by a license holder under this
22	<u>chapter.</u>
23	(b) A license holder under this chapter is qualified to
24	provide medical nutrition therapy in accordance with 42 U.S.C.
25	Section 1395x(vv).
26	SECTION 14. Section 701.259, Occupations Code, is repealed.
27	SECTION 15. The change in law made by this Act by the

1	enactment of Section 701.251(b)(3), Occupations Code, applies only
2	to the practice of dietetics and nutrition care services on or after
3	September 1, 2008. The practice of dietetics and nutrition care
4	services before that date is governed by the law in effect on the
5	date the practice occurred, and the former law is continued in
6	effect for that purpose.
7	SECTION 16. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
