- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- SECTION 1. Section 659.305, Government Code, is amended by 5
- amending Subsections (a), (d), (e), (f), and (g) and adding 6
- Subsection (h) to read as follows: 7
- (a) Except as provided by <u>Subsections</u> [<u>Subsection</u>] (b) <u>and</u> 8
- (h), the amount of a full-time state employee's hazardous duty pay 9
- for a particular month is the lesser of: 10
- 11 \$10 for each 12-month period of lifetime service
- 12 credit accrued by the employee; or
- (2) \$300. 13
- 14 (d) For purposes of Subsections (a)(1), [and] (b)(2), and
- (h), the number of 12-month periods of lifetime service credit that 15
- 16 the employee has accrued must be determined as of the last day of
- the preceding month. 17
- (e) A state employee is considered to be a full-time state 18
- employee for purposes of Subsection (a), [er] (b), or (h) if the 19
- employee is a full-time state employee for any portion of the first 20
- 21 workday of the month.
- The amount of a part-time state employee's hazardous 22
- 23 duty pay is proportional to the amount of a full-time state
- 24 employee's pay under Subsection (a), [or (b), or (h).

1	(g) A state employee may not receive more than \$10 or $$12$ , as
2	applicable, for each 12-month period of lifetime service credit,

4	(1) the number of positions the employee holds; or
5	(2) the number of hours the employee works each week.
6	(h) The amount of hazardous duty pay for a particular month
7	for a full-time correctional officer employed by the Texas
8	Department of Criminal Justice is the lesser of:
9	(1) \$12 for each 12-month period of lifetime service
10	credit accrued by the employee; or
11	<u>(2) \$300.</u>

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
