A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to a technology literacy assessment instrument to be 3 administered to certain public school students.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 39, Education Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 39.0235 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 39.0235. TECHNOLOGY LITERACY ASSESSMENT PILOT
- 8 PROGRAM. (a) In this section, "pilot program" means the technology
- 9 literacy assessment pilot program.
- 10 (b) The commissioner by rule shall establish a pilot program
- 11 in which a participating school district assesses student
- 12 <u>technology proficiency</u>.
- (c) A school district may apply to the commissioner to
- 14 participate in the pilot program. The commissioner shall select
- for participation school districts from both rural and urban areas
- of the state.

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- 17 (d) The agency shall adopt an assessment instrument
- designed to assess an individual student's mastery of the essential
- 19 knowledge and skills in technology to be administered by a school
- 20 district participating in the pilot program. The assessment
- 21 instrument adopted under this subsection must be an existing
- 22 product that is currently available.
- (e) Each school year, the assessment instrument adopted
- 24 under Subsection (d) shall be administered in a participating

- 1 school district to each student in either fifth, sixth, seventh,
- 2 eighth, or ninth grade, with the grade level and time to be
- 3 determined by the district.
- 4 (f) The assessment instrument adopted under Subsection (d)
- 5 must:
- 6 (1) be administered online;
- 7 (2) be aligned with the essential knowledge and skills
- 8 requirements for technology applications; and
- 9 (3) incorporate performance-based measures, including
- 10 a requirement that students perform certain technological tasks and
- 11 respond to questions based on the completion of those tasks.
- 12 (g) An assessment instrument administered by a
- 13 participating school district must be designed in a manner to
- 14 provide the district with an automatic report of the technology
- 15 literacy proficiency of a district student in a format that is
- 16 compatible with the school district and state data information
- 17 systems.
- 18 (h) A participating school district shall report student
- 19 performance on the assessment instrument to the agency.
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2007-2008
- 21 school year.
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
