2	relating to an intensive mathematics and algebra intervention pilot
3	program in public schools.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 29, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 29.095 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 29.095. INTENSIVE MATHEMATICS AND ALGEBRA
8	INTERVENTION PILOT PROGRAM. (a) In this section, "intervention
9	program" means the intensive mathematics and algebra intervention
10	pilot program.
11	(b) The commissioner by rule shall establish an
12	intervention pilot program in which a participating district will
13	provide:
14	(1) intensive mathematics intervention for students
15	who are not performing at grade level in mathematics in grades four
16	through seven; and
17	(2) algebra readiness intervention for students who
18	are not performing at grade level in mathematics in grade eight.
19	(c) Districts may implement the intensive mathematics and
20	algebra intervention pilot program at a campus whose population of
21	at-risk students exceeds the state average proportion of at-risk
22	students.
23	(d) A participating campus shall identify a student who does
24	not perform at grade level on an assessment instrument administered

under Section 39.023(a)(1), or an equivalent assessment instrument 1 2 administered under Section 39.023(1), as a student eligible for participation in the intervention program. During a student's 3 4 placement in the intervention program, a campus shall use progress monitoring assessments to ensure that a student is making 5 6 appropriate progress in the program. 7 (e) The commissioner shall adopt a list of mathematics and 8 algebra intervention programs that may be implemented by a school district and funded under this program. Programs placed on the 9 commissioner's list will be reviewed and recommended by a panel of 10 recognized experts in mathematics education. 11 12 (f) The commissioner shall adopt minimum criteria that a program must meet to be included on the list adopted by the 13 14 commissioner. The criteria must: 15 (1) include comprehensive course plans and teacher 16 guides that are organized around the essential knowledge and skills 17 curriculum for mathematics; (2) include technology-based 18 supplementary 19 instruction that can diagnose and address areas in which a student is identified to need improvement; 20 21 (3) include at least three cumulative days of training, professional development, and mentoring for teachers; 22 (4) provide students individual access 23 to 24 technology-based supplementary instruction at least 90 minutes 25 each week; 26 (5) provide teachers daily access to required 27 technology;

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(6) demonstrate significant effectiveness in schools 1 2 serving students identified as being at risk of dropping out of school, as described by Section 29.081(d); and 3 4 (7) be selected in consultation with the teachers at 5 the affected campus from the list adopted pursuant to Subsection 6 (e). 7 (g) The commissioner shall adopt rules necessary to 8 implement this section. 9 (h) Program Evaluation. The commissioner of education shall contract for the evaluation of the effectiveness of the 10 intervention program established under this section. The 11 12 commissioner may consider centers for education research to conduct this evaluation. The evaluation shall describe progress under the 13 14 assessment instruments administered under Section 39.023(a)(1) or 15 equivalent assessment instruments administered under Section 39.023(1) to students participating in the intervention program. 16 17 (i) Report to the Legislature. Not later than December 1 of each even-numbered year, the commissioner shall prepare and deliver 18 19 a report to the legislature that recommends any statutory changes the commissioner considers appropriate to promote improved 20 21 mathematics and algebra readiness in Texas schools. SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2007-2008 22

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23 school year.
24 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
