- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 29, Education Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 29.095 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 29.095. INTENSIVE MATHEMATICS AND ALGEBRA
 8 INTERVENTION PROGRAM. (a) In this section, "intervention program"
 9 means the intensive mathematics and algebra intervention program.
- 10 <u>(b) The commissioner by rule shall establish an</u>
 11 intervention program in which a participating campus provides:
- 12 <u>(1) intensive mathematics intervention for students</u>
 13 <u>who are not performing at grade level in mathematics in grades four</u>
 14 through seven; and
- 15 (2) algebra readiness intervention for students who 16 are not performing at grade level in mathematics in grade eight.
- 17 (c) An intervention program implemented by a campus must:
- 18 <u>(1) use current technology to diagnose student</u> 19 deficiencies; and
- 20 (2) allow a student to progress in a manner that is appropriate for the student.
- 22 (d) Beginning in grade three, a participating campus shall 23 identify a student who does not perform at grade level on an 24 assessment instrument administered under Section 39.023(a)(1), or

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- an equivalent assessment instrument administered under Section 39.023(1), as a student eligible for participation in the intervention program. A campus shall use entry-level screening and diagnostic assessments approved by the agency to determine appropriate student placement and level of instruction. During a student's placement in the intervention program, a campus shall use
- 7 progress monitoring assessments to ensure that a student is making
 8 appropriate progress in the program.
- 9 (e) The commissioner shall adopt a list of mathematics and
 10 algebra intervention programs that may be implemented by a school
 11 district. A district-level committee established under Subchapter
 12 F, Chapter 11, may also adopt a list of mathematics and algebra
 13 intervention programs that may be implemented by a district campus.
 14 A participating campus may implement only an intervention program
 15 from the list adopted by the commissioner or by the district-level
- 16 <u>committee.</u>
- 17 <u>(f) The commissioner shall adopt minimum criteria that a</u>
 18 <u>program must meet to be included on the list adopted by the</u>
 19 <u>commissioner or a district-level committee under Subsection (e).</u>
- 20 The criteria must:
- 21 (1) be based on mathematics performance standards
 22 required for student promotion under Section 28.0211;
- 23 (2) include diagnostic and progress monitoring 24 assessment tools;
- 25 (3) be based on scientifically validated methods;
- 26 (4) be organized around the essential knowledge and skills curriculum for mathematics for the applicable grade level;

1	(5) include the use of technology to promote
2	implementation of individualized instructional plans; and
3	(6) have been proven to:
4	(A) accelerate learning;
5	(B) improve cognitive ability; and
6	(C) increase mathematics proficiency.
7	(g) A campus participating in the intervention program
8	shall assess each participating student before the student enters
9	and after the student transfers out of the program to measure the
10	student's progress.
11	(h) The commissioner shall adopt rules necessary to
12	<pre>implement this section.</pre>
13	(i) Not later than December 31, 2008, the agency, in
14	consultation with each participating school district, shall
15	provide the legislature with a report describing student progress
16	under the assessment instruments administered under Section
17	39.023(a)(1), or the equivalent assessment instruments
18	administered under Section 39.023(1), to students participating in
19	the intervention program. This subsection expires June 1, 2009.
20	SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2007-2008
21	school year.
22	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
23	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
24	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
25	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
26	Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
