A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the creation of an arts and entertainment district by a populous municipality.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 10, Local Government Code, is amended by adding Chapter 309 to read as follows:

ARTS AND ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICTS CHAPTER 309.

Sec. 309.001. ARTS AND ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICTS. municipality with a population of more than one midesignate a defined area in the municipality as an entertainment district to develop a public and (a) million may and arts private collaboration that plays a vital role in the cultural life and development of the community in the district.

(b) The municipality shall develop the area in the district that it contributes to the public through interpretive,

educational, and recreational uses.

(c) The municipality may solicit grants and donations for the development of the district.

(d) The municipality may provide incentives to persons to develop the area in the district for public purposes.

(e) The municipality may provide tax breaks to persons in

the district to develop the district for public purposes.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
