A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to a temporary moratorium on permits for certain
- 3 coal-fired electric generating facilities and to a contemporaneous
- 4 study of the projected demand for electric generating capacity in
- 5 this state and the potential for and consequences of reducing or
- 6 meeting that demand by various means.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 8 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act:
- 9 (1) "Commission" means the Texas Commission on
- 10 Environmental Quality.
- 11 (2) "Modification of existing facility" has the
- meaning assigned by Section 382.003, Health and Safety Code.
- 13 SECTION 2. TEMPORARY MORATORIUM. (a) Until the second
- 14 anniversary of the effective date of this Act, the commission may
- 15 not accept an application for, issue, or renew a permit or permit
- 16 amendment for:
- 17 (1) the construction of a new pulverized coal-fired
- 18 electric generating facility; or
- 19 (2) the modification of an existing pulverized
- 20 coal-fired electric generating facility.
- 21 (b) This section applies to the issuance or renewal of a
- 22 permit or permit amendment regardless of whether the application
- 23 for the permit or permit amendment is pending on the effective date
- 24 of this Act.

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- 1 SECTION 3. STUDY AND REPORT. (a) The commission shall
- 2 conduct a study of:
- 3 (1) this state's demand for electric generation
- 4 capacity for the next 10 years;
- 5 (2) the potential for reducing that demand through
- 6 conservation and other means;
- 7 (3) the potential for meeting that demand through
- 8 renewable energy electric generation technology;
- 9 (4) the environmental effects of meeting that demand
- 10 by means of the various existing and proposed electric generation
- 11 technologies, including the effects on air quality in
- 12 nonattainment, near nonattainment, and early action compact areas;
- 13 (5) the effects on rates for electricity of meeting
- 14 that demand by means of the various existing and proposed electric
- 15 generation technologies; and
- 16 (6) any other related matters as determined by the
- 17 commission.
- 18 (b) The commission may consult with the Electric
- 19 Reliability Council of Texas and the Public Utility Commission of
- 20 Texas in conducting the study.
- 21 (c) Not later than the second anniversary of the effective
- 22 date of this Act, the commission shall submit a report of the
- 23 results of the study to the legislature.
- 24 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 25 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 26 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 27 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for

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1 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
