3	studies in the fifth grade.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 39.023(a), Education Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	(a) The agency shall adopt or develop appropriate
8	criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed to assess
9	essential knowledge and skills in reading, writing, mathematics,
10	social studies, and science. All students, except students
11	assessed under Subsection (b), [ <del>or</del> ] (1), or (n) or exempted under
12	Section 39.027, shall be assessed in:
13	(1) mathematics, annually in grades three through
14	seven without the aid of technology and in grades eight through 11
15	with the aid of technology on any assessment instruments that
16	include algebra;
17	(2) reading, annually in grades three through nine;
18	(3) writing, including spelling and grammar, in grades
19	four and seven;
20	(4) English language arts, in grade 10;
21	(5) social studies, in grades <u>five</u> , eight, and 10;
22	(6) science, in grades five, eight, and 10; and
23	(7) any other subject and grade required by federal
24	law.

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SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 39, Education Code, is 1 2 amended by adding Section 39.0236 to read as follows: Sec. 39.0236. ASSESSMENT IN SOCIAL STUDIES: FIFTH GRADE. 3 4 (a) As provided by this section, students in grade five may be assessed in social studies as required by Section 39.023(a)(5) 5 6 through the administration of the reading assessment instrument 7 required by Section 39.023(a)(2). 8 (b) Selections included in the reading assessment

9 <u>instrument for grade five under Section 39.023(a)(2) shall contain</u> 10 <u>historical selections with an emphasis on primary source documents.</u> 11 <u>(c) The commissioner by rule may:</u>

12 <u>(1) determine the portion of the selections to include</u> 13 <u>in the reading assessment instrument for purposes of assessing</u> 14 <u>essential knowledge and skills in social studies for students in</u> 15 <u>grade five; and</u>

16 (2) develop procedures for segregating the reporting 17 of results of student performance on the fifth grade social studies 18 portion of the reading assessment instrument under this section.

19 SECTION 3. The commissioner of education shall adopt rules 20 for the implementation of Section 39.023(a)(5), Education Code, as 21 amended by this Act, and may adopt rules for the implementation of 22 Section 39.0236, Education Code, as added by this Act. The 23 commissioner's rules must provide that:

(1) except as provided by Subdivision (3) of this
section, not later than the 2010-2011 school year, the State Board
of Education shall administer a social studies assessment
instrument to students in the fifth grade as provided by Section

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1 39.023(a)(5), Education Code, as amended by this Act;

2 (2) except as provided by Subdivision (4) of this section, not later than the 2012-2013 school year, the Texas 3 Education Agency shall include the results of student performance 4 5 on the fifth grade social studies assessment instrument required by 6 Section 39.023(a)(5), Education Code, as amended by this Act, in 7 evaluating the performance of school districts, campuses, and 8 open-enrollment charter schools under Subchapter D, Chapter 39, 9 Education Code;

10 (3) not later than the 2012-2013 school year, the 11 State Board of Education shall administer an assessment instrument 12 under Section 39.023(b), Education Code, that corresponds to the 13 fifth grade social studies assessment instrument required by 14 Section 39.023(a)(5), Education Code, as amended by this Act; and

(4) not later than the 2014-2015 school year, the
Texas Education Agency shall include the results of student
performance on the assessment instrument described by Subdivision
(3) of this section in evaluating the performance of school
districts, campuses, and open-enrollment charter schools under
Subchapter D, Chapter 39, Education Code.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
