A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a medical assistance opt-out program.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
- is amended by adding Section 32.04221 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 32.04221. MEDICAL ASSISTANCE OPT-OUT PROGRAM. (a) In
- 7 this section:
- 8 (1) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services
- 9 Commission.
- 10 (2) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
- 11 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
- 12 (3) "Group health benefit plan" means a plan described
- by Section 1207.001, Insurance Code.
- 14 (b) The commission shall seek a waiver from an appropriate
- 15 federal agency under which a person who is eligible for or is a
- 16 recipient of medical assistance may choose to opt out of receiving
- 17 services under the medical assistance program and instead enroll in
- a group health benefit plan offered by an employer.
- 19 (c) Consistent with the terms of the waiver, for a
- 20 participant in the opt-out program who enrolls in a group health
- 21 benefit plan offered by an employer, the commission shall provide
- 22 for payment of the employee's share of the required premiums,
- 23 except that if the employee's share of the required premiums
- 24 exceeds the estimated Medicaid costs for the individual's risk

- 1 group, as determined by the executive commissioner, the participant
- 2 shall pay the difference between the required premiums and those
- 3 estimated costs. In addition, the participant shall pay all
- 4 deductibles, copayments, coinsurance, and other cost-sharing
- 5 obligations imposed on the participant under the group health
- 6 benefit plan.
- 7 (d) The commission shall ensure that participation by a
- 8 person in the opt-out program is on a voluntary basis, and the
- 9 commission may not require any person to opt out of receiving
- 10 <u>medical assistance services.</u>
- (e) A participant in the opt-out program is limited to the
- 12 health benefits coverage provided under the health benefits plan in
- which the participant enrolls. The participant may not receive any
- 14 benefits or services under the medical assistance program other
- than the premium payment as provided by Subsection (c).
- 16 (f) The commission shall develop procedures by which a
- 17 participant in the opt-out program may, at the participant's
- 18 option, resume receiving benefits and services under the medical
- 19 assistance program instead of through a group health benefit plan.
- 20 (g) The commission shall implement an outreach campaign to
- 21 educate applicants for and recipients of medical assistance
- 22 <u>regarding the opt-out program.</u>
- 23 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 24 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 25 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 26 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 27 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the

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- 1 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
