LO	Sec. 661.041. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
L1	(1) "Governing body" includes a single statewide
L2	elected or appointed officer who heads a state agency.
L3	(2) "State agency" means a state board, commission,
L4	office, institution, or other agency in any branch of state
L5	government, including an institution of higher education as defined
L6	by Section 61.003, Education Code. The term includes a public
L7	junior college.
L8	(3) "State employee" means an employee of a state
L9	agency.

21	PROGRAM FOR PAYMENT AT DISCOUNTED RATE. (a) The governing body of a
22	state agency may institute a program under which an employee of the
23	agency may voluntarily choose to receive payment for a portion of

the employee's accrued vacation or sick leave at a discounted rate

- 1 <u>in lieu of taking the leave.</u>
- 2 (b) The governing body shall set the discount rate. On
- 3 request the comptroller shall assist the governing body in
- 4 determining an appropriate discount rate.
- 5 (c) The governing body shall set a limit on the number of
- 6 hours of vacation or sick leave for which an employee may receive a
- 7 <u>discounted payment and prescribe a minimum number of hours of</u>
- 8 vacation and sick leave that must remain accrued or be taken by the
- 9 employee.
- 10 (d) On receiving payment for a number of hours of accrued
- 11 vacation or sick leave at a discounted rate, the number of hours for
- 12 which the employee received a discounted payment are deducted from
- 13 the applicable accrued leave balances.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
