## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a study on an adult diabetes education program in
3	certain county hospital systems and hospital districts.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 1001, Health and Safety
6	Code, is amended by adding Section 1001.0761 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1001.0761. STUDY ON ADULT DIABETES EDUCATION. (a) The
8	department shall conduct a study of the feasibility and cost of
9	providing an adult diabetes education program to be offered in
10	counties with populations of more than 100,000 by hospital
11	districts and county hospital systems. The department may select a
12	division, committee, or employee of the department to conduct the
13	study.
14	(b) A hospital district or county hospital system that
15	receives funding under the program would be required to:
16	(1) make the adult diabetes education program
17	available in English and Spanish using a curriculum developed by
18	the Texas Diabetes Council; and

(2) make the education program available in the

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- (c) Not later than June 1, 2008, the Texas Diabetes Council 22 23 shall develop a proposed curriculum for the adult diabetes
- 24 education program and provide a copy of the proposed curriculum to

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- 1 the department. The curriculum must emphasize life choices that
- 2 enable a diabetic patient to control the disease and improve the
- 3 patient's standard of living.
- 4 (d) Not later January 1, 2009, the department shall deliver
- 5 to the legislature a report on:
- 6 (1) the results of the study conducted under
- 7 Subsection (a), including the feasibility and cost of providing the
- 8 program;
- 9 (2) a plan of action for implementing the adult
- 10 diabetes education program in hospital districts and county
- 11 hospital systems;
- 12 (3) an analysis of any diabetes education programs
- 13 currently offered to adults by hospital districts and county
- 14 hospital systems, including the costs and effectiveness of the
- 15 programs; and
- 16 (4) a copy of the proposed curriculum developed by the
- 17 Texas Diabetes Council.
- 18 (e) This section expires June 1, 2010.
- 19 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
