9	Sec. 614.121. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
10	(1) "Volunteer fire department" has the meaning
11	assigned by Section 614.101.
12	(2) "Volunteer firefighter" means an individual who:
13	(A) is a member of a volunteer fire department
14	that performs firefighting or firefighting support activities
15	under a contract with or at the request of a state agency or
16	political subdivision; or
17	(B) is assigned by a state agency or political
18	subdivision to perform, without compensation, firefighting or
19	firefighting support activities.
20	(3) "Volunteer police force member" means:
21	(A) a person summoned under Section 341.011,
22	Local Government Code, to serve on a special police force;
23	(B) a police reserve force member appointed under
24	Section 341.012, Local Government Code; and

1 (C) any other person assigned by a state agency 2 or political subdivision to perform, without compensation, any duties typically performed by a peace officer. 3 4 Sec. 614.122. INSURANCE COVERAGE REQUIRED. Each volunteer 5 firefighter or volunteer police force member must be insured by the 6 applicable state agency or political subdivision against any injury suffered by the volunteer firefighter or police force member in the 7 course and scope of performing the person's assigned duties at the 8 9 request of or under a contract with a state agency or political 10 subdivision. SECTION 2. Subchapter H, Chapter 614, Government Code, as 11 added by this Act, applies only to a volunteer firefighter or 12 volunteer police force member performing assigned duties on or 13 14 after January 1, 2008. SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007. 15
