4	SECTION 1. Section 418.073, Government Code, is amended by
5	amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (c) and (d) to read
6	as follows:
7	(b) [If the governor finds that the demands placed on funds
8	regularly appropriated to state and local agencies are unreasonably
9	great for coping with a particular disaster, the governor with the
10	concurrence of the disaster emergency funding board may make funds
11	available from the disaster contingency fund.] It is the intent of
12	the legislature that in responding to an emergency or disaster, the
13	first recourse of state and local agencies should be to the funds
14	regularly appropriated to <u>those</u> [state and local] agencies.
15	(c) A state agency, local government, or other eligible
16	entity may request funding from the disaster contingency fund to
17	pay for:
18	(1) extraordinary costs incurred in implementing
19	preventive measures taken before or during an emergency; and
20	(2) costs incurred in repairing damage suffered during
21	a disaster for which:
22	(A) the presiding officer of a municipal or
23	county government has declared a local state of disaster for
24	affected areas within the jurisdiction of the municipality or

2	(B) the governor has also declared a state of
3	disaster for the affected county or counties; and
4	(C) the federal government has not issued an
5	emergency or disaster declaration for the affected area that would
6	activate federal emergency assistance.
7	(d) The Governor's Division of Emergency Management shall
8	administer the disaster contingency fund and shall develop and
9	implement rules and procedures for providing emergency assistance
10	from the fund.
11	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
12	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
1 2	provided by Costion 20 Article III Meyros Constitution If this

13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
