Section 2262.002(b), Government Code, is amended 5 to read as follows: 6 Except as otherwise provided by this chapter, this 7 (b) [This] chapter does not apply to contracts of the Texas Department 8 of Transportation that: 9 (1) relate to highway construction or 10 highway 11 engineering; or 12 (2) are subject to Section 201.112, Transportation 13 Code. SECTION 2. Section 2262.101, Government Code, is amended to 14 15 read as follows: Sec. 2262.101. CREATION; DUTIES. The Contract Advisory 16 Team is created to assist state agencies in improving contract 17 18 management practices by: 19 (1) [reviewing the solicitation of major contracts by state agencies; 20 21 [(2)] reviewing any findings or recommendations made 22 by the state auditor, including those made under Section 2262.052(b), regarding a state agency's compliance with the 23 contract management guide; and 24

6	SECTION 3. Chapter 2262, Government Code, is amended by
7	adding Subchapter D to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER D. STATE OFFICE OF CONTRACT MANAGEMENT
9	Sec. 2262.151. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
10	(1) "High-risk contract" means a state agency contract
11	that:

13	(B) has a value of less than \$10 million, but has
14	high-risk factors as identified by the office.

The 5 commission shall establish a state office of contract management 6 to: 7 (1) develop criteria for identifying high-risk 8 factors in contracts; 9 (2) review and approve an action related to a 10 high-risk contract as provided by Section 2262.154; (3) provide recommendations and assistance to state 11 12 agency personnel throughout the contract management process; and (4) coordinate and consult with the quality assurance 13 14 team on all high-risk contracts relating to a major information 15 resources project. 16 Sec. 2262.154. REVIEW AND APPROVAL; WAIVER. (a) Each state 17 agency must receive approval from the office before taking the following actions in relation to a high-risk contract: 18 19 (1) publicly releasing solicitation documents; (2) executing a final contract; and 20 21 (3) making a payment or a series of payments that equal half of the contract value. 22 23 (b) In determining whether to approve an action described by 24 Subsection (a), the office shall review related documentation to 25 ensure that potential risks related to the high-risk contract have 26 been identified and mitigated. (c) The commission by rule may adopt criteria for waiving 27

1	the review and approval requirements under Subsections (a) and (b).
2	Sec. 2262.155. SOLICITATION AND CONTRACT CANCELLATION.
3	After review of and comment on the matter by the Legislative Budget
4	Board and the governor, the office may recommend the cancellation
5	of a solicitation or a contract during the review process under
6	Section 2262.154 if:
7	(1) a proposed solicitation is not in the best
8	interest of the state;
9	(2) a proposed contract would place the state at an
10	unacceptable risk if executed; or
11	(3) an executed contract is experiencing performance
12	failure or payment irregularities.
13	SECTION 4. Section 2262.051(f), Government Code, is
14	repealed.
15	SECTION 5. Subchapter D, Chapter 2262, Government Code, as
16	added by this Act, applies only in relation to a contract:
17	(1) for which the solicitation of bids, offers,
18	qualifications, proposals, or similar expressions of interest is
19	published on or after September 1, 2007;
20	(2) that is extended or modified on or after September
21	1, 2007; or
22	(3) for which a change order is submitted on or after
23	September 1, 2007.
24	SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
25	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
26	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
27	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
