7	amended by adding Section 571.0789 to read as follows:

9	REPORTS ON WEBSITE. (a) This section applies to a statement,
10	registration, or report filed with the commission under:
11	(1) Chapter 302, 303, 305, 572, or 2004;
12	(2) Subchapter C, Chapter 159, Local Government Code,
13	by a county judicial officer, as defined by Section 159.051, Local
14	Government Code, who elects to file a financial statement with the
15	<pre>commission; or</pre>
16	(3) Title 15, Election Code.
17	(b) The commission shall post on its Internet website each
18	statement, registration, or report filed with the commission not
19	later than:
20	(1) the 3rd business day after the date on which the
21	statement, registration, or report is filed, if the statement,
22	registration, or report is filed electronically; or
23	(2) the 10th business day after the date on which the
24	statement, registration, or report is filed, if the statement,

1	registration, or report is not filed electronically.
2	(c) Not later than November 1, 2007, the commission shall
3	post on its website each personal financial statement filed with
4	the commission for the 2000 calendar year or a later calendar year
5	under:
6	(1) Chapter 572; or
7	(2) Subchapter C, Chapter 159, Local Government Code,
8	by a county judicial officer who elects to file a financial
9	statement with the commission.
10	(d) Subsection (c) and this subsection expire January 1,
11	2008.
12	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
13	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
14	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
15	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

16 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
