- 11 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, if a disaster, as defined
- 12 by Section 418.004, occurs in a first tier coastal county or a

- 15 presiding judge of the administrative judicial region, with the
- 16 approval of the judge of the affected district court, may designate

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(b) Notwithstanding any other law, including a specific provision in this chapter for a particular court or county that requires a statutory county court to conduct its proceedings at the county seat, if a disaster, as defined by Section 418.004, occurs in a first tier coastal county or a second tier coastal county that precludes a statutory county court in that county from conducting its proceedings at the county seat, the presiding judge of the administrative judicial region, with the approval of the judge of the affected statutory county court, may designate an alternate location in the county at which the court may conduct its 11 proceedings.

  - (b) Notwithstanding any other law, including a specific provision in this chapter for a particular court or county that requires a statutory probate court to conduct its proceedings at the county seat, if a disaster, as defined by Section 418.004, occurs in a first tier coastal county or a second tier coastal county that precludes a statutory probate court in that county from conducting its proceedings at the county seat, the presiding judge of the statutory probate courts, with the approval of the judge of the affected statutory probate court, may designate an alternate location in the county at which the court may conduct its

- 8 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, including Section
- 9 26.002(c), if a disaster, as defined by Section 418.004, occurs in a
- 10 first tier coastal county or a second tier coastal county that
- 11 precludes the county court from conducting its proceedings at the
- 12 county seat, the presiding judge of the administrative judicial
- 13 region, with the approval of the judge of the affected county court,
- 14 may designate an alternate location in the county at which the court

- 16 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
