A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to increasing the number of transfer students at general
- 3 academic teaching institutions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 51.808, Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 51.808. APPLICATION OF ADMISSION CRITERIA TO OTHER
- 8 PROGRAMS. (a) Each general academic teaching institution or medical
- 9 and dental unit that offers [admissions to undergraduate transfer
- 10 students or] admissions to a graduate, postgraduate, or
- 11 professional program shall [also] adopt a written admission policy
- 12 applicable to those programs.
- 13 (b) Each general academic teaching institution shall adopt
- 14 a written admission policy to promote the admission of
- 15 undergraduate transfer students to the institution. The policy
- 16 must provide for outreach and recruiting efforts directed at junior
- 17 colleges and other lower-division institutions of higher education
- 18 and may include incentives, to encourage transfer applications and
- 19 to retain and promote transfer students. The policy must provide
- 20 for a number of undergraduate transfer students to be admitted to
- 21 the institution so that, of the students enrolled in their junior or
- 22 <u>senior year at the institution, at least:</u>
- 23 <u>(1) 15 percent are undergraduate transfer students</u>
- 24 beginning with the 2009 fall semester;

- 1 (2) 30 percent are undergraduate transfer students
- beginning with the 2011 fall semester; and
- 3 (3) 40 percent are undergraduate transfer students
- 4 beginning with the 2013 fall semester.
- 5 (c) A [The] policy adopted under this section shall be
- 6 published in the institution's or unit's catalog and made available
- 7 to the public.
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
