- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 32.155, Education Code,
- 5 as added by Chapter 834, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular
- 6 Session, 2003, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 32.155. ANNUAL PROGRESS REPORT [COMMUNITY EDUCATIONAL
- 8 PIPELINE PROCRESS TEAM].
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 32.155(e), Education Code, as added by
- 10 Chapter 834, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003,
- 11 is amended to read as follows:
- 12 (e) The board of trustees of each district participating in
- the pilot project shall send an annual progress report to the agency
- 14 not later than August 1 of each year that the district is
- 15 participating in the pilot project. The report must state in detail
- 16 the [type of plan being used in the district or school and the]
- 17 effect of the pilot project on the district or school, including:
- 18 (1) the academic progress of students who are
- 19 participating in a pilot project, as measured by performance on
- 20 assessment instruments;
- 21 (2) if applicable, a comparison of student progress in
- 22 a school or classroom that is participating in the pilot project as
- 23 compared with student progress in the schools or classrooms in the
- 24 district that are not participating in the pilot project;

- 1 (3) any elements of the pilot project that contribute
- 2 to improved student performance on assessment instruments
- 3 administered under Section 39.023 or any other assessment
- 4 instrument required by the agency;
- 5 (4) any cost savings and improved efficiency relating
- 6 to school personnel and the maintenance of facilities;
- 7 (5) any effect on student dropout and attendance
- 8 rates;
- 9 (6) any effect on student enrollment in higher
- 10 education;
- 11 (7) any effect on teacher performance and retention;
- 12 (8) any improvement in communications among students,
- 13 teachers, parents, and administrators;
- 14 (9) any improvement in parent involvement in the
- 15 education of the parent's child;
- 16 (10) any effect on community involvement and support
- 17 for the district or school; and
- 18 (11) any increased student proficiency in
- 19 technologies that will help prepare the student for becoming a
- 20 member of the workforce.
- 21 SECTION 3. Sections 32.154(c) and 32.155(a) through (d),
- 22 Education Code, as added by Chapter 834, Acts of the 78th
- 23 Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, are repealed.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
