15 SECTION 2. Title 10, Chapter 1701, Section 1701.160, 16 Occupations Code, is amended as follows:

Sec. 1701.160. AUTHORITY TO COMMISSION INVESTIGATORS AS PEACE OFFICERS. The commission may commission certified peace officers as investigators employed by the commission<u>.</u> for the limited purpose of assisting the commission in administering this chapter.
