A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a language immersion pilot project in certain school
3	districts.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 29, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter J to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER J. LANGUAGE IMMERSION PILOT PROJECT
8	Sec. 29.351. ESTABLISHMENT OF PILOT PROJECT. The
9	commissioner shall establish a pilot project in school districts
10	selected by the commissioner under which the agency examines
11	language immersion programs and the effect of those programs on a
12	student's ability to advance to high school, graduate from high
13	school, or prepare for college coursework or postgraduation
14	employment.
15	Sec. 29.352. PILOT PROJECT ADMINISTRATION. (a) The
16	commissioner shall establish a procedure and adopt criteria for the
17	agency to administer the pilot project.
18	(b) In adopting criteria under this section, the
19	commissioner shall require the agency to select only school
20	districts or campuses that:
21	(1) demonstrate a substantial enrollment of:
22	(A) students with limited English proficiency;
23	or
24	(B) bilingual students;

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1	(2) demonstrate parent, teacher, and community
2	support for a language immersion program;
3	(3) will commit to a language immersion program in a
4	language other than English as selected by the district for a
5	minimum of three years in elementary grades;
6	(4) will offer in secondary grades at least one
7	language program in a language other than English or the language
8	used in the language immersion program provided under Subdivision
9	(3); and
10	(5) demonstrate the potential for expanding the
11	programs provided under Subdivisions (3) and (4) across primary and
12	secondary grades, including:
13	(A) incorporating the program provided under
14	Subdivision (3) in kindergarten; and
15	(B) offering the program provided under
16	Subdivision (4) for four years in high school.
17	(c) The agency shall require a school district or campus
18	selected under this subchapter to provide annual self-evaluations
19	of progress toward language immersion program goals.
20	Sec. 29.353. PILOT PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION. (a) The
21	commissioner by rule shall require a school district or campus to
22	limit activities of the language immersion program during the first
23	year of the program to:
24	(1) planning activities, including:
25	(A) hiring and training teachers and other
26	professional development activities as determined by the
27	commissioner; and

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1	(B) acquiring adequate instructional and
2	technological materials in each program language, including
3	software; and
4	(2) expanding or improving existing language
5	immersion programs.
6	(b) The commissioner by rule shall develop procedures to
7	assign a technical assistance team that includes university faculty
8	with expertise in language learning to assist participating school
9	districts and campuses in program development, implementation, and
10	assessment.
11	Sec. 29.354. SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CAMPUS SELECTION. (a) The
12	agency shall select school districts and campuses to participate in
13	the pilot project using the criteria provided by Section 29.352(b)
14	and based on the readiness of the district or campus to incorporate
15	language immersion programs into classrooms as demonstrated by the
16	past performance of the district or campus relating to language
17	instruction.
18	(b) In selecting participants, the agency shall consider
19	geographic diversity.
20	(c) The agency shall select not more than 10 school
21	districts and not more than 30 elementary schools to participate in
22	the pilot project.
23	(d) A school district that applies for the expansion of an
24	existing language immersion program is eligible for a grant under
25	this subchapter.
26	Sec. 29.355. PILOT PROJECT FUNDING. (a) To implement the
27	pilot project, the agency may use only undedicated and unobligated

money from the general revenue fund for purposes of the pilot 1 2 project. 3 (b) The agency may not spend an amount more than \$5 million 4 per year for the language immersion pilot project under this subchapter. The spending limitation imposed by this subsection 5 6 does not apply to an expenditure made by the commissioner under 7 Section 29.356(c). 8 (c) To supplement the funding for the pilot project, the agency may use any gift, grant, or donation given for the pilot 9 project. The agency may solicit and accept a gift, grant, or 10 donation of any kind from any source, including from a foundation, 11 private entity, governmental entity, or institution of higher 12 education, for the implementation of the pilot project. 13 14 (d) Funds for the pilot project may not be used for the 15 construction of a building or other facility. 16 (e) The agency shall use funds under this subchapter for: (1) teacher training in implementing the language 17 immersion programs; 18 (2) hiring technical support staff for school 19 20 districts or campuses participating in the pilot project; and 21 (3) purchasing technology-based instructional 22 materials and resources. Sec. 29.356. PILOT PROJECT GRANTS. (a) From amounts 23 appropriated to the agency, including foundation school program 24 funds, the commissioner shall award grants to school districts and 25 campuses that participate in the program. A grant under this 26 section must be in an amount sufficient to pay the costs to the 27

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district or campus of participating in the program, as determined 1 2 by the commissioner. A determination of the commissioner under this subsection is final and may not be appealed. 3 4 (b) During the 2007-2008 school year, the commissioner may 5 award grants to school districts and campuses under this section 6 only for the purpose of planning activities described by Section 7 29.355(e) in an amount not to exceed five percent of the total amount required to fully implement the pilot program for the 8 2008-2009 school year. 9 (c) To expand language learning opportunities for all 10 public school students and school district employees, including 11 12 students and employees in school districts not participating in the pilot project, the commissioner shall enter into a contract to 13 license language-learning software using language immersion 14 15 methods. Expenditures under this subsection must be sufficient to support language learning opportunities for a maximum of one 16 17 million public school students and employees for a maximum of three years. The commissioner shall make the software available online 18 to public school students and employees across the state not later 19 than January 1, 2008. The commissioner may not spend more than \$4 20 21 million each year to comply with this subsection. Sec. 29.357. COMMUNITY EDUCATIONAL PIPELINE PROGRESS 22 TEAM. (a) Each participating school district or campus shall 23 24 establish a community educational pipeline progress team to assist 25 in developing and implementing the language immersion pilot 26 project.

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(b) The board of trustees of a participating school district

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1	or of a school district in which a participating campus is located
2	shall appoint individuals to the team. The team may be composed of:
3	(1) educators;
4	(2) district-level administrators;
5	<pre>(3) community leaders;</pre>
6	(4) parents of students who attend a participating
7	campus; and
8	(5) any other individual the board finds appropriate.
9	(c) The team shall develop an academic improvement plan that
10	describes the manner in which the pilot project should be
11	implemented in the participating school district or campus. In
12	developing the academic improvement plan, the team shall consider:
13	(1) the educational problems in the district or at the
14	campus that could be mitigated through the implementation of the
15	pilot project; and
16	(2) the technological and nontechnological resources
17	that are necessary to ensure successful implementation of the pilot
18	project.
19	(d) The team shall recommend to the board of trustees the
20	manner in which the pilot project funds should be used to implement
21	the academic improvement plan developed under Subsection (c).
22	Annually, the team may recommend to the board any necessary changes
23	in the academic improvement plan. The agency must approve the
24	academic improvement plan or any changes to the plan before
25	disbursing pilot project funds to the board.
26	(e) The board of trustees of each district participating in
27	the pilot project shall provide an annual progress report to the

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1	agency not later than August 1 of each year that the district is
2	participating in the pilot project. The report must state in detail
3	the type of plan used in the district or at the campus and the effect
4	of the pilot project on the district or campus, including:
5	(1) any effect on the academic progress of students
6	who are participating in a pilot project, as measured by
7	performance on assessment instruments, including assessment
8	instruments administered under Section 39.023;
9	(2) if applicable, a comparison of student progress at
10	a campus or in a classroom in a school district that is
11	participating in the pilot project as compared to student progress
12	at a campus or in a classroom in that same district that is not
13	participating in the pilot project;
14	(3) any elements of the pilot project that contribute
15	to improved student performance on assessment instruments
16	administered under Section 39.023 or any other assessment
17	instrument required by the agency;
18	(4) any cost savings or improved efficiency relating
19	to school personnel or the maintenance of school facilities;
20	(5) any effect on student attendance or dropout rates;
21	(6) any effect on student enrollment in high school;
22	(7) any effect on teacher performance or retention;
23	(8) any improvement in communications among students,
24	parents, teachers, and administrators;
25	(9) any improvement in parental involvement in the
26	education of the parent's child;
27	(10) any effect on community involvement and support

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1	for the district or campus; and
2	(11) any increase in student proficiency in technology
3	that would help prepare students for becoming members of the
4	workforce.
5	Sec. 29.358. PILOT PROJECT EVALUATION. (a) The agency
6	shall perform an annual review of the language immersion pilot
7	project based on the reports the agency receives from the board of
8	trustees of participating school districts. The agency shall
9	include a summary of the review of the pilot project in the
10	comprehensive annual report required under Section 39.182.
11	(b) During the 2010-2011 school year, the agency shall
12	contract with one or more educational research centers to evaluate
13	the efficacy of the pilot project to determine whether the pilot
14	project should be continued. The cost of the evaluation may not
15	exceed \$250,000.
16	Sec. 29.359. EXPIRATION. This subchapter expires September
17	<u>1, 2011.</u>
18	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
19	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
20	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
21	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

22 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
