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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to a language immersion pilot project in certain school 3 districts. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 29, Education Code, is amended by adding Subchapter J to read as follows: 6 SUBCHAPTER J. LANGUAGE IMMERSION PILOT PROJECT 7 Sec. 29.351. ESTABLISHMENT OF PILOT PROJECT. The 8 commissioner shall establish a pilot project in school districts 9 selected by the commissioner under which the agency examines 10 11 language immersion programs and the effect of those programs on a 12 student's ability to advance to high school, graduate from high school, or prepare for college coursework or postgraduation 13 14 employment. Sec. 29.352. PILOT PROJECT ADMINISTRATION. (a) The 15 commissioner shall establish a procedure and adopt criteria for the 16 agency to administer the pilot project. 17 18 (b) In adopting criteria under this section, the commissioner shall require the agency to select only school 19 districts or campuses that: 20 21 (1) demonstrate a substantial enrollment of: 22 (A) students with limited English proficiency; 23 or 24 (B) bilingual students;

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1	(2) demonstrate parent, teacher, and community
2	support for a language immersion program;
3	(3) will commit to a language immersion program in a
4	language other than English as selected by the district for a
5	minimum of three years in elementary grades;
6	(4) will offer in secondary grades at least one
7	language program in a language other than English or the language
8	used in the language immersion program provided under Subdivision
9	(3); and
10	(5) demonstrate the potential for expanding the
11	programs provided under Subdivisions (3) and (4) across primary and
12	secondary grades, including:
13	(A) incorporating the program provided under
14	Subdivision (3) in kindergarten; and
15	(B) offering the program provided under
16	Subdivision (4) for four years in high school.
17	(c) The agency shall require a school district or campus
18	selected under this subchapter to provide annual self-evaluations
19	of progress toward language immersion program goals.
20	Sec. 29.353. PILOT PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION. (a) The
21	commissioner by rule shall require a school district or campus to
22	limit activities of the language immersion program during the first
23	year of the program to:
24	(1) planning activities, including:
25	(A) hiring and training teachers and other
26	professional development activities as determined by the
27	commissioner; and

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1	(B) acquiring adequate instructional and
2	technological materials in each program language, including
3	software; and
4	(2) expanding or improving existing language
5	immersion programs.
6	(b) The commissioner by rule shall develop procedures to
7	assign a technical assistance team that includes university faculty
8	with expertise in language learning to assist participating school
9	districts and campuses in program development, implementation, and
10	assessment.
11	Sec. 29.354. SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CAMPUS SELECTION. (a) The
12	agency shall select school districts and campuses to participate in
13	the pilot project using the criteria provided by Section 29.352(b)
14	and based on the readiness of the district or campus to incorporate
15	language immersion programs into classrooms as demonstrated by the
16	past performance of the district or campus relating to language
17	instruction.
18	(b) In selecting participants, the agency shall consider
19	geographic diversity.
20	(c) The agency shall select not more than 10 school
21	districts and not more than 30 elementary schools to participate in
22	the pilot project.
23	(d) A school district that applies for the expansion of an
24	existing language immersion program is eligible for a grant under
25	this subchapter.
26	Sec. 29.355. PILOT PROJECT FUNDING. (a) To implement the
27	pilot project, the agency may use only undedicated and unobligated

money from the general revenue fund for purposes of the pilot 1 2 project. 3 (b) The agency may not spend an amount more than \$5 million 4 per year for the language immersion pilot project under this 5 subchapter. 6 (c) To supplement the funding for the pilot project, the 7 agency may use any gift, grant, or donation given for the pilot project. The agency may solicit and accept a gift, grant, or 8 donation of any kind from any source, including from a foundation, 9 private entity, governmental entity, or institution of higher 10 education, for the implementation of the pilot project. 11 12 (d) Funds for the pilot project may not be used for the construction of a building or other facility. 13 14 (e) The agency shall use funds under this subchapter for: 15 (1) teacher training in implementing the language 16 immersion programs; 17 (2) hiring technical support staff for school districts or campuses participating in the pilot project; and 18 (3) purchasing technology-based instructional 19 materials and resources. 20 21 Sec. 29.356. PILOT PROJECT GRANTS. (a) From amounts appropriated to the agency, including foundation school program 22 funds, the commissioner shall award grants to school districts and 23 24 campuses that participate in the program. A grant under this section must be in an amount sufficient to pay the costs to the 25 26 district or campus of participating in the program, as determined by the commissioner. A determination of the commissioner under 27

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1	this subsection is final and may not be appealed.
2	(b) During the 2007-2008 school year, the commissioner may
3	award grants to school districts and campuses under this section
4	only for the purpose of planning activities described by Section
5	29.355(e) in an amount not to exceed five percent of the total
6	amount required to fully implement the pilot program for the
7	<u>2008-2009 school year.</u>
8	(c) To expand language learning opportunities for all
9	public school students and school district employees, including
10	students and employees in school districts not participating in the
11	pilot project, the commissioner shall enter into a contract to
12	license language-learning software using language immersion
13	methods. The commissioner shall make the software available online
14	to public school students and employees across the state not later
15	than January 1, 2008.
16	Sec. 29.357. COMMUNITY EDUCATIONAL PIPELINE PROGRESS
17	TEAM. (a) Each participating school district or campus shall
18	establish a community educational pipeline progress team to assist
19	in developing and implementing the language immersion pilot
20	project.
21	(b) The board of trustees of a participating school district
22	or of a school district in which a participating campus is located
23	shall appoint individuals to the team. The team may be composed of:
24	(1) educators;
25	(2) district-level administrators;
26	<pre>(3) community leaders;</pre>
27	(4) parents of students who attend a participating

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1	campus; and
2	(5) any other individual the board finds appropriate.
3	(c) The team shall develop an academic improvement plan that
4	describes the manner in which the pilot project should be
5	implemented in the participating school district or campus. In
6	developing the academic improvement plan, the team shall consider:
7	(1) the educational problems in the district or at the
8	campus that could be mitigated through the implementation of the
9	pilot project; and
10	(2) the technological and nontechnological resources
11	that are necessary to ensure successful implementation of the pilot
12	project.
13	(d) The team shall recommend to the board of trustees the
14	manner in which the pilot project funds should be used to implement
15	the academic improvement plan developed under Subsection (c).
16	Annually, the team may recommend to the board any necessary changes
17	in the academic improvement plan. The agency must approve the
18	academic improvement plan or any changes to the plan before
19	disbursing pilot project funds to the board.
20	(e) The board of trustees of each district participating in
21	the pilot project shall provide an annual progress report to the
22	agency not later than August 1 of each year that the district is
23	participating in the pilot project. The report must state in detail
24	the type of plan used in the district or at the campus and the effect
25	of the pilot project on the district or campus, including:
26	(1) any effect on the academic progress of students
27	who are participating in a pilot project, as measured by

performance on assessment instruments, including assessment 1 2 instruments administered under Section 39.023; 3 (2) if applicable, a comparison of student progress at 4 a campus or in a classroom in a school district that is 5 participating in the pilot project as compared to student progress 6 at a campus or in a classroom in that same district that is not 7 participating in the pilot project; 8 (3) any elements of the pilot project that contribute 9 improved student performance on assessment instruments to administered under Section 39.023 or any other assessment 10 instrument required by the agency; 11 (4) any cost savings or improved efficiency relating 12 to school personnel or the maintenance of school facilities; 13 14 (5) any effect on student attendance or dropout rates; 15 (6) any effect on student enrollment in high school; (7) any effect on teacher performance or retention; 16 17 (8) any improvement in communications among students, parents, teachers, and administrators; 18 19 (9) any improvement in parental involvement in the education of the parent's child; 20 21 (10) any effect on community involvement and support for the district or campus; and 22 (11) any increase in student proficiency in technology 23 24 that would help prepare students for becoming members of the 25 workforce. Sec. 29.358. PILOT PROJECT EVALUATION. (a) The agency 26 27 shall perform an annual review of the language immersion pilot

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project based on the reports the agency receives from the board of 1 2 trustees of participating school districts. The agency shall include a summary of the review of the pilot project in the 3 4 comprehensive annual report required under Section 39.182. (b) During the 2010-2011 school year, the agency shall 5 6 contract with one or more educational research centers to evaluate the efficacy of the pilot project to determine whether the pilot 7 project should be continued. The cost of the evaluation may not 8 9 exceed \$250,000. Sec. 29.359. EXPIRATION. This subchapter expires September 10

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
