APPOINTMENT OF COUNTY AUDITOR. 7 (a) Tn a county with a population of 18,000 [10,200] or more, the district 8 9 judges shall appoint a county auditor. In a county with a population of less than 18,000 10 (b) $[\frac{10,200}{200}]$: 11 12 (1) the district judges may appoint a county auditor 13 if the judges determine that the county's financial circumstances warrant the appointment; and 14 (2) the district judges shall appoint a county auditor 15 if: 16 (A) the commissioners court finds that a county 17 auditor is necessary to carry out county business and enters an 18 order in its minutes stating the reason for this finding; 19 (B) the order is certified to the district 20 21 judges; and (C) the district judges find the reason stated by 22 23 the commissioners court to be good and sufficient. SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 24

a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
