A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to provisional voting by a person who applied for an early 3 voting ballot by mail. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 63.011, Election Code, is amended by 5 6 adding Subsection (a-1) and amending Subsection (b) to read as follows: 7 (a-1) A person to whom the early voting clerk was required 8 to provide an early voting ballot by mail under Section 86.001 and 9 who did not vote early by mail may cast a provisional ballot on 10 election day if the person executes an affidavit stating that the 11 12 person: (1) is a registered voter in the precinct in which the 13 14 person seeks to vote; and 15 (2) did not vote early by mail. A form for an affidavit required by this section [the 16 (b) affidavit] shall be printed on an envelope in which the provisional 17 ballot voted by the person may be placed and must include a space 18 for entering the identification number of the provisional ballot 19 voted by the person. The affidavit form may include space for 20 21 disclosure of any necessary information to enable the person to register to vote under Chapter 13. The secretary of state shall 22 prescribe the form of the affidavit under this section. 23 SECTION 2. Section 65.054(b), Election Code, is amended to 24

2 (b) A provisional ballot may be accepted only if the board 3 determines that, from the information in the affidavit or contained 4 in public records, the person is eligible to vote in the election 5 <u>and has not previously voted in that election</u>.

6 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 7 an election ordered on or after September 1, 2007.
