H.B. No. 2827

1 AN ACT

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2 relating to rules regarding anaphylaxis treatment provided by 3 emergency medical services personnel.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 773.014, Health and Safety Code, is amended by amending Subsections (a), (b), and (c), and adding Subsection (c-1) to read as follows:

- (a) An emergency medical services provider and a first responder organization may acquire and possess epinephrine auto-injector devices in accordance with this section. Emergency medical services personnel [certified as emergency medical technicians or at a higher level of training] may carry and administer epinephrine auto-injector devices in accordance with this section.
- 15 The department shall adopt rules designed to protect the (b) public health and safety to implement this section. The rules must 16 provide that emergency medical services personnel [certified as 17 emergency medical technicians or at a higher level of training] may 18 administer an epinephrine auto-injector device to another only if 19 the person has successfully completed a training course, approved 20 21 by the department, in the use of the device that is consistent with 22 the national standard training curriculum for emergency medical 23 technicians.
- 24 (c) An emergency medical services provider or first

- 1 responder organization may acquire, possess, maintain, and dispose
- 2 of epinephrine auto-injector devices, and emergency medical
- 3 services personnel [certified as emergency medical technicians or
- 4 at a higher level of training | may carry, maintain, administer, and
- 5 dispose of epinephrine auto-injector devices, only in accordance
- 6 with:
- 7 (1) rules adopted by the department under this
- 8 section; and
- 9 (2) a delegated practice agreement that provides for
- 10 medical supervision by a licensed physician who either:
- 11 (A) acts as a medical director for an emergency
- 12 medical services system or a licensed hospital; or
- 13 (B) has knowledge and experience in the delivery
- 14 of emergency care.
- 15 (c-1) A licensed physician acting as a medical director for
- 16 an emergency medical services system may restrict the use and
- 17 administration of epinephrine auto-injector devices to certain
- 18 <u>emergency medical services personnel of the system through:</u>
- 19 <u>(1)</u> the delegated practice agreement; or
- 20 (2) the adoption of policies governing the use of the
- 21 <u>devices by personnel within the system.</u>
- SECTION 2. Section 773.050, Health and Safety Code, is
- 23 amended by adding Subsection (g) to read as follows:
- 24 (g) Rules adopting minimum standards under this section
- 25 shall require:
- 26 (1) an emergency medical services vehicle to be
- 27 equipped with an epinephrine auto-injector device or similar device

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- 1 to treat anaphylaxis; and
- 2 (2) emergency medical services personnel to complete
- 3 continuing education training in the administration of anaphylaxis
- 4 <u>treatment.</u>
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
