2 relating to restrictions on written information required to be 3 provided by school districts and public school teachers.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 7.060, Education Code, is amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:

- (c) In addition to the requirements otherwise prescribed by this section, the commissioner shall adopt policies that result in a reduction of at least 10 percent in the total amount of written paperwork, reports, and other information that a school district is required by the agency to prepare, as determined in comparison to the total amount of written paperwork, reports, and other information required to be prepared by a school district during the 2006-2007 school year. The policies must be implemented beginning not later than the 2008-2009 school year. This subsection expires September 1, 2009.
- SECTION 2. Section 11.164, Education Code, is amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- (d) In addition to the requirements otherwise prescribed by
 this section, the board of trustees of each school district shall
 adopt policies that result in a reduction of at least 10 percent in
 the total amount of written information that a teacher is required
 to prepare, as determined in comparison to the total amount of
 written information required to be prepared by a teacher during the

- 1 2006-2007 school year. A school district shall implement the
 2 policies required by this subsection beginning not later than the
 3 2008-2009 school year. This subsection expires September 1, 2009.
- 3 2008-2009 school year. This subsection expires September 1, 2009.
 4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
