4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 161, Human Resources Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 161.075 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 161.075. LIFESPAN RESPITE SERVICES PILOT PROGRAM. (a)
8	In this section, "respite services" means support services,
9	including in-home services or adult day-care services, that are
LO	provided for the purpose of temporarily giving relief to a primary
L1	caregiver who provides care to an individual with a chronic illness
L2	or disability.
L3	(b) The department shall implement the lifespan respite
L4	services pilot program to promote the provision of respite services
L5	and to develop state and local infrastructure for the provision of
L6	those services.
L7	(c) A person is eligible to participate in the pilot program
L8	if the person:
L9	(1) is the primary caregiver for a person who:
20	(A) is younger than 60 years of age;
21	(B) is related to the caregiver within the second
22	degree of consanguinity or affinity; and
23	(C) has a chronic illness or disability; and
24	(2) meets criteria specified in rules adopted by the

- 1 executive commissioner.
- 2 (d) In implementing the pilot program, the department
- 3 shall:
- 4 (1) maintain a registry of respite services providers;
- 5 (2) connect caregivers participating in the program
- 6 with available respite services providers;
- 7 (3) coordinate resources among respite services
- 8 providers;
- 9 (4) build local partnerships with respite services
- 10 providers;
- 11 (5) implement public awareness activities regarding
- 12 respite services; and
- 13 (6) subject to the availability of funds, provide
- 14 vouchers for respite services to caregivers participating in the
- program who are not eligible for respite services provided through
- 16 other programs.
- 17 (e) The executive commissioner shall:
- 18 (1) select the area of this state in which to implement
- 19 the pilot program; and
- 20 (2) adopt rules necessary to implement the pilot
- 21 program.
- 22 (f) This section expires September 1, 2009.
- 23 SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2008, the executive
- 24 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission, in
- 25 consultation with the Department of Aging and Disability Services,
- 26 shall submit a report to the governor and the Legislative Budget
- 27 Board regarding the lifespan respite services pilot program

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- 1 established under Section 161.075, Human Resources Code, as added
- 2 by this Act. The report must include an evaluation of the effect of
- 3 the pilot program on:
- 4 (1) access to respite services by primary caregivers
- of persons with chronic illnesses or disabilities; and
- 6 (2) Medicaid expenditures for long-term care services
- 7 provided in institutional care settings.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
