A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to consolidated billing and collection of fees and 3 payments of certain sewer service corporations and water supply corporations. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 13, Water Code, is amended by adding Section 13.146 to read as follows: 7 8 Sec. 13.146. CONSOLIDATED BILLING AND COLLECTION CONTRACTS. (a) A retail public utility providing water service may 9 contract with a retail public utility providing sewer service to 10 11 bill and collect the sewer service provider's fees and payments as 12 part of a consolidated process with the billing and collection of the water service provider's fees and payments. The water service 13 14 provider may provide that service only for customers who are served by both providers in an area covered by both providers' 15 16 certificates of public convenience and necessity. If the water service provider refuses to enter into a contract under this 17 18 section or if the water service provider and sewer service provider cannot agree on the terms of a contract, the sewer service provider 19 may petition the commission to issue an order requiring the water 20 21 service provider to provide that service. (b) A contract or order under this section must provide 22

22 (b) A contract or order under this section must provide 23 procedures and deadlines for submitting billing and customer 24 information to the water service provider and for the delivery of

1	collected fees and payments to the sewer service provider.
2	(c) A contract or order under this section may require or
3	permit a water service provider that provides consolidated billing
4	and collection of fees and payments to:
5	(1) terminate the water services of a person whose
6	sewage services account is in arrears for nonpayment; and
7	(2) charge a customer a reconnection fee if the
8	customer's water service is terminated for nonpayment of the
9	customer's sewage services account.
10	(d) A water service provider that provides consolidated
11	billing and collection of fees and payments may impose on each sewer
12	service provider customer a reasonable fee to recover costs
13	associated with providing consolidated billing and collection of
14	fees and payments for sewage services.
15	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
