1	AN ACT
2	relating to performance audits of certain regional transportation
3	authorities.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 452.454(c), Transportation Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(c) Each audit must include an examination of:
8	(1) one or more of the following:
9	(A) the administration and management of the
10	authority;
11	(B) transit operations; or
12	(C) transit authority system maintenance;
13	(2) the authority's compliance with applicable state
14	law, including this chapter; and
15	(3) the following performance indicators:
16	(A) <u>subsidy per passenger</u> , operating cost per
17	[ <del>passenger, per</del> ] revenue mile, and <u>operating cost</u> per revenue hour;
18	(B) sales and use tax receipts per passenger;
19	(C) fare recovery rate;
20	(D) <u>number of passengers per hour</u> [ <del>average</del>
21	<pre>vehicle occupancy];</pre>
22	(E) on-time performance;
23	(F) number of accidents per 100,000 miles; and
24	(G) number of miles between mechanical <u>service</u>

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1 [<del>road</del>] calls.

SECTION 2. Section 452.455, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Subsection (c-1) and amending Subsections (g) through (j) to read as follows:

5 (c-1) The subsidy per passenger is computed by subtracting 6 annual operating revenues from annual operating costs and dividing 7 that amount by the total number of passengers for the same period.

8 (g) The <u>number of passengers per hour</u> [average vehicle 9 occupancy] is computed by dividing the <u>total number of</u> annual 10 <u>passengers</u> [<del>passenger miles</del>] by the <u>total</u> number of [miles traveled 11 <del>by</del> authority] revenue <u>vehicle hours</u> [vehicles while in revenue 12 service for the same period. The annual passenger miles are 13 computed by multiplying the annual passenger trips and the average 14 distance ridden by passengers] for the same period.

15 (h) On-time performance is computed by determining an 16 annual percentage of revenue vehicle trips of revenue vehicles that 17 depart from selected locations at a time not earlier than the 18 published departure time and not later than five minutes after that 19 published time. <u>On-time performance is computed only for fixed</u> 20 <u>route revenue service.</u>

(i) The number of accidents per 100,000 miles is computed by multiplying the annual number of accidents by 100,000 and dividing the product by the number of miles for all service, including charter and nonrevenue service[, directly operated by the authority] for the same period. In this subsection, "accident" includes:

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(1) a collision that involves an authority's revenue

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1 vehicle, other than a lawfully parked revenue vehicle, and results
2 in property damage, injury, or death; and

3 (2) an <u>operating</u> incident resulting in the injury or 4 death of a person on board or boarding or alighting from an 5 authority's revenue vehicle.

6 (j) The number of miles between mechanical service [road] 7 calls is computed by dividing the annual number of miles for all 8 service [directly operated by an authority], including charter service and nonrevenue service, by the number of mechanical service 9 [road] calls for the same period. In this subsection, "mechanical 10 service [road] call" means an interruption in revenue service that 11 is caused by revenue vehicle equipment failure that requires 12 assistance from a person other than the vehicle operator before the 13 14 vehicle can be operated normally.

SECTION 3. Sections 452.455(k)(2) and (4), Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:

17 (2) <u>"Passenger" or "passenger</u> [<del>"Passenger</del>] trips"
18 means the number of all passenger boardings, including transfers,
19 but excluding charter passengers and carpool and vanpool passengers
20 whose trips are only coordinated by the authority.

21 (4) "Revenue vehicle" means a vehicle, or a 22 <u>combination of rail vehicles comprising a train</u>, that is: 23 (A) used to carry paying passengers; and 24 (B) operated by an authority or as a purchased 25 service.

26 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
