A person who owns real property in this state that is enclosed by a fence or other structure obviously designed to exclude intruders or to contain 1-14 1**-**15 1**-**16 1-17 livestock or other animals may obtain from a court in this state a 1-18 judgment entitling the person to a lien against the motor vehicle of a person who damages the landowner's fence with the motor vehicle if 1-19 the person who damages the landowner's fence: (1) owns the motor vehicle; or 1-20 1-21 1-22 (2) has the consent of the owner of the motor vehicle 1-23 to drive the vehicle at the time the person damages the landowner's 1-24 fence. Sec. 70.502. AMOUNT OF LIEN. The amount of a landowner's lien under this subchapter is equal to the lesser of: 1-25 1-26 (1) the fair market value of the motor vehicle on the 1-27 1-28 date the landowner's fence is damaged; or the actual cost incurred by the landowner to: 1-29 (2) 1-30 (A) repair the fence; 1-31 (B) recapture any livestock or other animals that escaped as a direct result of the damage to the fence; and 1-32 1-33 (C) have the vehicle towed from the property and 1-34 stored. Sec. 70.503. PROPERTY TO WHICH LIEN ATTACHES. A landowner's lien under this chapter attaches only to a motor 1-35 1-36 vehicle that causes damage to a fence as described by Section 1-37 70.501. 1-38 Sec. 70.504. PERFECTING LIEN. A landowner may perfect a lien under this subchapter in the manner provided by Subchapter F, Chapter 501, Transportation Code. Sec. 70.505. EXPIRATION AND DISCHARGE OF LIEN. REMOVAL OF VEHICLE FROM LANDOWNER'S PROPERTY.
