4	SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 10, Local Government Code, is
5	amended by adding Chapter 309 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 309. FILM DISTRICTS
7	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
8	Sec. 309.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Board" means a district's board of directors.
10	(2) "District" means a film district created under
11	this chapter.
12	Sec. 309.002. NATURE OF DISTRICT. A district is a political
13	subdivision of this state and a special district.
14	[Sections 309.003-309.050 reserved for expansion]
15	SUBCHAPTER B. CREATION
16	Sec. 309.051. CREATION BY POPULOUS MUNICIPALITY. A
17	municipality with a population of one million or more may create a
18	district as provided by this subchapter to promote the film
19	industry in a designated area in the municipality.
20	Sec. 309.052. HEARING. Before creating a district, the
21	governing body of a municipality must hold a hearing on the purposes
22	and advisability of creating the district. Any interested person
23	may speak at the hearing.

1	(a) After a hearing under Section 309.052, if a governing body finds
2	that the municipality and the designated area would benefit from
3	the district's creation, the governing body by order may create the
4	<u>district.</u>
5	(b) The order must specify:
6	(1) the district's boundaries, which must be wholly in
7	the municipality;
8	(2) the number and qualifications of directors to be
9	appointed under Section 309.103; and
10	(3) the initial directors and the terms of those
11	initial directors, consistent with Subsection (c).
12	(c) The initial directors' terms must be staggered, with as
13	near as possible to half of the directors' terms expiring on the
14	same date in not more than one year and the remainder expiring on
15	the same date in not more than two years.

17	SUBCHAPTER C. BOARD OF DIRECTORS
18	Sec. 309.101. GOVERNING BODY. A district is governed by a
19	board of at least seven directors.
20	Sec. 309.102. TERMS. Directors serve staggered two-year

22	Sec. 309.103. APPOINTMENT BY MUNICIPALITY. The governing
23	body of a municipality that creates a district shall appoint the
24	directors as provided by the order creating the district. The

26	(1) two directors who represent the interests of the

1	(2) one director who represents a local or regional
2	film commission that:
3	(A) is part of an international professional and
4	educational organization for film commissions; and
5	(B) has an office located in the municipality, if
6	a film commission described by Paragraph (A) has an office located

8	(3) one director who represents a school district that
9	has the majority of its territory located in the municipality;
10	(4) one director who represents an institution of
11	higher education, as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code,
12	located in the municipality;
13	(5) one director who represents a public junior
14	college, as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, located in
15	the municipality; and
16	(6) any other directors as provided by the order

18	Sec. 309.104. COMPENSATION; EXPENSES. A director is not
19	entitled to compensation but is entitled to reimbursement for

22	officer, secretary, treasurer, and any other officers the board
23	considers necessary.

25	SUBCHAPTER D. POWERS AND DUTIES
26	Sec. 309.151. PROMOTION OF FILM INDUSTRY. A district shall
27	promote the film industry in the district.

Sec. 309.152. PARTNERSHIP WITH LOCAL COMMUNITIES. A 1 2 district shall act jointly with the municipality, local businesses, the film industry, and other local communities to promote the film 3 4 industry in the district. Sec. 309.153. INCENTIVES. A district may provide 5 6 incentives to promote the film industry in the district. 7 Sec. 309.154. DONATIONS; GRANTS. A district may accept a 8 donation or grant from any person for any district purpose. Sec. 309.155. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR; EMPLOYEES. A district 9 may hire an executive director and other employees. 10 [Sections 309.156-309.200 reserved for expansion] 11 SUBCHAPTER E. FINANCIAL PROVISIONS 12 Sec. 309.201. BORROWING. A district may borrow money from 13 14 any person for any district purpose. 15 [Sections 309.202-309.250 reserved for expansion] 16 SUBCHAPTER F. DISSOLUTION 17 Sec. 309.251. DISSOLUTION. A board may dissolve a district that has no debt. 18 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 21 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
