A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to the creation, powers, and duties of film districts.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 10, Local Government Code, is
5	amended by adding Chapter 309 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 309. FILM DISTRICTS
7	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
8	Sec. 309.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Board" means a district's board of directors.
LO	(2) "District" means a film district created under
L1	this chapter.
L2	Sec. 309.002. NATURE OF DISTRICT. A district is a political
L3	subdivision of this state and a special district.
L4	<pre>[Sections 309.003-309.050 reserved for expansion]</pre>
L5	SUBCHAPTER B. CREATION
L6	Sec. 309.051. CREATION BY POPULOUS MUNICIPALITY. A
L7	municipality with a population of one million or more may create a
L8	district as provided by this subchapter to promote the film
L9	industry in a designated area in the municipality.
20	Sec. 309.052. HEARING. Before creating a district, the
21	governing body of a municipality must hold a hearing on the purposes
22	and advisability of creating the district. Any interested person
23	may speak at the hearing.

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Sec. 309.053. ORDER CREATING DISTRICT; INITIAL DIRECTORS.

- 1 (a) After a hearing under Section 309.052, if a governing body finds
- 2 that the municipality and the designated area would benefit from
- 3 the district's creation, the governing body by order may create the
- 4 district.
- 5 (b) The order must specify:
- 6 (1) the district's boundaries, which must be wholly in
- 7 <u>the municipality;</u>
- 8 (2) the number and qualifications of directors to be
- 9 appointed under Section 309.103; and
- 10 (3) the initial directors and the terms of those
- 11 initial directors.
- 12 (c) The initial directors' terms must be staggered, with as
- 13 near as possible to half of the directors' terms expiring in one
- 14 year and the remainder expiring in two years.

- SUBCHAPTER C. BOARD OF DIRECTORS
- 17 Sec. 309.101. GOVERNING BODY. A district is governed by a
- 18 board of at least seven directors.
- 19 Sec. 309.102. TERMS. Directors serve staggered two-year
- 20 terms.
- Sec. 309.103. APPOINTMENT BY MUNICIPALITY. The governing
- 22 body of a municipality that creates a district shall appoint the
- 23 directors as provided by the order creating the district. The
- 24 directors must include:
- 25 (1) two directors who represent the interests of the
- 26 municipality and reside in the municipality;
- 27 (2) one director who represents a local or regional

- 1 film commission located in the municipality;
- 2 (3) one director who represents a school district that
- 3 has the majority of its territory located in the municipality;
- 4 (4) one director who represents an institution of
- 5 higher education, as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code,
- 6 located in the municipality;
- 7 (5) one director who represents a public junior
- 8 college, as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, located in
- 9 the municipality; and
- 10 (6) any other directors as provided by the order
- 11 creating the district.
- Sec. 309.104. COMPENSATION; EXPENSES. A director is not
- 13 entitled to compensation but is entitled to reimbursement for
- 14 actual and necessary expenses.
- Sec. 309.105. OFFICERS. A board shall elect a presiding
- officer, secretary, treasurer, and any other officers the board
- 17 considers necessary.

- 19 SUBCHAPTER D. POWERS AND DUTIES
- Sec. 309.151. PROMOTION OF FILM INDUSTRY. A district shall
- 21 promote the film industry in the district.
- 22 <u>Sec. 309.152. PARTNERSHIP WITH LOCAL COMMUNITIES. A</u>
- 23 district shall act jointly with the municipality, local businesses,
- the film industry, and other local communities to promote the film
- 25 industry in the district.
- 26 <u>Sec. 309.153. INCENTIVES. A district may provide</u>
- 27 incentives to promote the film industry in the district.

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1	Sec. 309.154. DONATIONS; GRANTS. A district may accept a
2	donation or grant from any person for any district purpose.
3	Sec. 309.155. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR; EMPLOYEES. A district
4	may hire an executive director and other employees.
5	[Sections 309.156-309.200 reserved for expansion]
6	SUBCHAPTER E. FINANCIAL PROVISIONS
7	Sec. 309.201. BORROWING. A district may borrow money from
8	any person for any district purpose.
9	[Sections 309.202-309.250 reserved for expansion]
10	SUBCHAPTER F. DISSOLUTION
11	Sec. 309.251. DISSOLUTION. A board may dissolve a district
12	that has no debt.
13	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
14	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
15	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
16	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

17 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
