H.B. No. 2979

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT 1 2 relating to a study regarding state financial assistance to 3 students enrolled at public institutions of higher education. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 61.051, Education Code, is amended by 5 adding Subsection (a-5) to read as follows: 6 (a-5) The board and the Legislative Budget Board jointly 7 shall study and evaluate the feasibility and economic effectiveness 8 9 of using the TEXAS grant program under Subchapter M, Chapter 56, to provide financial assistance primarily to lower-division students 10 enrolled at institutions of higher education and the Texas 11 12 B-On-time loan program under Subchapter Q, Chapter 56, to provide financial assistance primarily to upper-division students enrolled 13 14 at those institutions. As part of the biennial report submitted by the board to the 81st Legislature under Subsection (a-3), the board 15 16 and the Legislative Budget Board jointly shall report the results of the study to the legislature. The report must include any 17 recommendation of the board and the Legislative Budget Board for 18 legislation or administrative action, including changes to state 19 agency rules and other changes necessary to promote efficiency and 20 21 effectiveness in the use of money to fund the TEXAS grant program and the Texas B-On-time loan program. A recommendation under this 22 23 subsection must include an explanation of the basis for the recommendation. Not later than December 1, 2008, the board and the 24

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Legislative Budget Board shall submit a copy of the financial 1 2 assistance report required by this subsection to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of 3 4 representatives. This subsection expires January 31, 2009. 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 7 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

9 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
