H.B. No. 2990

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to use of certain electronic monitoring technology in 3 certain correctional facilities by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 494, Government Code, is amended by 6 adding Section 494.0111 to read as follows: 7 Sec. 494.0111. RADIO FREQUENCY IDENTIFICATION ELECTRONIC 8 9 MONITORING SYSTEMS. (a) In this section, "radio frequency identification electronic monitoring system" means an electronic 10 11 monitoring system that: 12 (1) tracks in real time the location of a person 13 wearing a remote transmitter through the constant sending and 14 receiving of signals between a centralized monitoring center and the remote transmitter; 15 16 (2) is compatible with the wireless transmission of information and has sufficient bandwidth to support additional 17 18 wireless networking devices; and 19 (3) is capable of: (A) using an encrypted bar code or similar unique 20 21 identification label to track pharmaceuticals, meals, and other 22 goods provided to inmates by the department; 23 (B) serving as a time-keeping system for 24 individuals who wear a transmitter;

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1	(C) recording an inmate's attendance at a program
2	or class the inmate is required to attend; and
3	(D) recording information that may be stored for
4	at least six months.
5	(b) In any correctional facility the construction of which
6	begins on or after September 1, 2007, the department shall ensure
7	that the correctional facility is designed and built to use a radio
8	frequency identification electronic monitoring system to monitor
9	effectively and efficiently the physical location and safety of:
10	(1) all inmates housed by the department in the
11	facility;
12	(2) all employees of the department working in the
13	facility;
14	(3) all third-party vendors or other contractors who
15	work in the facility; and
16	(4) all visitors to the facility who are granted
17	access to areas of the facility to which only employees are normally
18	admitted.
19	(c) In any correctional facility the construction of which
20	began before September 1, 2007, the department may retrofit the
21	correctional facility to use a radio frequency identification
22	electronic monitoring system to monitor effectively and
23	efficiently the physical location and safety of:
24	(1) all inmates housed by the department in the
25	facility;
26	(2) all employees of the department working in the
27	<pre>facility;</pre>

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1	(3) all third-party vendors or other contractors who
2	work in the facility; and
3	(4) all visitors to the facility who are granted
4	access to areas of the facility to which only employees are normally
5	admitted.
6	(d) The department shall require all individuals described
7	by Subsections (b) and (c) to wear radio frequency identification
8	transmitters while they are housed, working in, or visiting a
9	facility that is designed and built or retrofitted to use a radio
10	frequency identification electronic monitoring system.
11	(e) A radio frequency identification transmitter provided
12	to an individual other than an inmate must enable the individual to
13	summon assistance or report an emergency by pushing a button on the
14	transmitter.
15	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
