1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the administration by certain health care professionals
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 301.002(2), Occupations Code, is amended
- 7 (2) "Professional nursing" means the performance of an
- 8 act that requires substantial specialized judgment and skill, the
- 9 proper performance of which is based on knowledge and application
- 10 of the principles of biological, physical, and social science as
- 11 acquired by a completed course in an approved school of
- 12 professional nursing. The term does not include acts of medical
- 13 diagnosis or the prescription of therapeutic or corrective
- 14 measures. Professional nursing involves:
- 15 (A) the observation, assessment, intervention,
- 16 evaluation, rehabilitation, care and counsel, or health teachings
- of a person who is ill, injured, infirm, or experiencing a change in
- 18 normal health processes;

to read as follows:

- 19 (B) the maintenance of health or prevention of
- 20 illness;

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- (C) the administration of a medication or
- 22 treatment as ordered by a physician, podiatrist, [or] dentist, or
- 23 therapeutic optometrist;
- 24 (D) the supervision or teaching of nursing;

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- 1 (E) the administration, supervision, and
- 2 evaluation of nursing practices, policies, and procedures;
- 3 (F) the requesting, receiving, signing for, and
- 4 distribution of prescription drug samples to patients at sites in
- 5 which a registered nurse is authorized to sign prescription drug
- 6 orders as provided by Subchapter B, Chapter 157;
- 7 (G) the performance of an act delegated by a
- 8 physician under Section 157.052, 157.053, 157.054, 157.0541,
- 9 157.0542, 157.058, or 157.059; and
- 10 (H) the development of the nursing care plan.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 454.213(b), Occupations Code, is amended
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 (b) Implementation of direct occupational therapy to a
- 14 person for a specific health care condition must be based on a
- 15 referral from:
- 16 (1) a physician licensed by a state board of medical
- 17 examiners;
- 18 (2) a dentist licensed by a state board of dental
- 19 examiners;
- 20 (3) a chiropractor licensed by a state board of
- 21 chiropractic examiners;
- 22 (4) a podiatrist licensed by a state board of
- 23 podiatric medical examiners; [or]
- 24 (5) an optometrist or therapeutic optometrist
- licensed by a state optometry board; or
- 26 (6) another qualified, licensed health care
- 27 professional who is authorized to refer for health care services

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- 1 within the scope of the professional's license.
- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
