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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the certification of water treatment specialists. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subchapter G, Chapter 341, Health and Safety 4 5 Code, is transferred to Subtitle A, Title 12, Occupations Code, 6 redesignated as Chapter 1904, Occupations Code, and amended to read as follows: 7 CHAPTER 1904. WATER TREATMENT SPECIALISTS 8 SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS [G. CERTIFICATION OF WATER 9 TREATMENT SPECIALISTS] 10 11 Sec. 1904.001 [341.101]. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter 12 [subchapter]: (1)"Commission" means the Texas Natural Resource 13 14 Conservation Commission. (2) "Installation of water treatment appliances" 15 includes connecting the appliances to all necessary utility 16 connections in residential, commercial, or industrial facilities. 17 (3) "Water treatment" means a business conducted under 18 contract that requires experience in the analysis of water, 19 including the ability to determine how to treat influent and 20 21 effluent water, to alter or purify water, and to add or remove a 22 mineral, chemical, or bacterial content or substance. The term 23 also includes the installation and service of potable water treatment equipment in public or private water systems and making 24

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1 connections necessary to complete installation of a water treatment
2 system.

3 (4) "Water treatment equipment" includes appliances
4 used to alter or purify water or to alter a mineral, chemical, or
5 bacterial content or substance.

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SUBCHAPTER B. CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

8 Sec. <u>1904.051</u> [341.102]. WATER TREATMENT SPECIALIST 9 CERTIFICATION PROGRAM. (a) The commission by rule shall establish 10 a program to certify persons qualified to install, exchange, 11 service, and repair residential, commercial, or industrial water 12 treatment equipment and appliances.

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(b) The rules must establish:

14 (1) standards for certification to ensure the public
15 health and to protect the public from unqualified persons engaging
16 in activities relating to water treatment;

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(2) classes of certification;

(3) duration of certification; and

(4) reasonable annual certification fees in an amount
sufficient to pay the administrative costs of the certification
program, but not to exceed \$150 a year for any class of
certification.

Sec. <u>1904.052</u> [341.103]. CERTIFICATION REQUIRED. A person may not engage in water treatment unless the person first obtains a certificate from the commission under the program established under this <u>chapter</u> [subchapter].

Sec. <u>1904.053</u> [341.104]. APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATION. A

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1 person desiring to obtain certification under the program
2 established under this <u>chapter</u> [subchapter] shall file with the
3 commission:

4 (1) an application in the form prescribed by the 5 commission and containing the information required by the 6 commission; and

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(2) the appropriate certification fee.

8 Sec. <u>1904.054</u> [<u>341.105</u>]. ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATE. (a) On 9 receipt of an application that meets commission requirements and 10 the required fee, the commission shall issue to a person who meets 11 commission standards for certification a certificate stating that 12 the person is qualified to install, exchange, service, and repair 13 residential, commercial, or industrial water treatment facilities.

(b) All fees received by the commission under this section
shall be deposited in the State Treasury to the credit of the
General Revenue Fund.

17 <u>Sec. 1904.055. EXEMPTIONS. (a)</u> [(c)] A person who holds a 18 license under Chapter 1301[, Occupations Code,] is exempt from the 19 requirements of this <u>chapter</u> [subchapter].

20 <u>(b)</u> [(d)] This <u>chapter</u> [subchapter] does not apply to an 21 employee of an industrial facility installing or servicing water 22 treatment equipment.

23 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.

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
