- 2 relating to merit pay for certain qualified professionals employed
- 3 by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice or the Texas Youth

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 493.007, Government Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (e) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (b) The executive director shall develop a system of annual
- 10 performance evaluations. Except as provided by Subsection (e), all
- 11 [All] merit pay for department employees must be based on the system
- 12 established under this subsection.
- (e) The executive director shall adopt a policy providing
- 14 for merit pay for a person who:
- 15 (1) is a licensed chemical dependency counselor or has
- 16 at least two years of experience in chemical dependency counseling
- and is a licensed social worker, professional counselor, physician,
- 18 or psychologist; and
- 19 (2) has repaid a student loan owed by the person.
- SECTION 2. Section 61.0354, Human Resources Code, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 61.0354. JOB PERFORMANCE EVALUATIONS; MERIT PAY. (a)
- 23 The executive director or the executive director's designee shall
- 24 develop a system of annual performance evaluations that are based

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- 1 on documented employee performance. Except as provided by
- 2 Subsection (b), all [All] merit pay for commission employees must
- 3 be based on the system established under this section.
- 4 (b) The executive director shall adopt a policy providing
- 5 for merit pay for a person who:
- 6 (1) is a licensed chemical dependency counselor or has
- 7 at least two years of experience in chemical dependency counseling
- 8 and is a licensed social worker, professional counselor, physician,
- 9 or psychologist; and
- 10 (2) has repaid a student loan owed by the person.
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 493.007, Government Code, and Section
- 12 61.0354, Human Resources Code, as amended by this Act, apply only to
- 13 merit pay for work performed by an employee of the Texas Department
- of Criminal Justice or the Texas Youth Commission on or after the
- 15 effective date of this Act. Merit pay for work performed before the
- 16 effective date of this Act is covered by the law in effect on the
- 17 date the work was performed, and the former law is continued in
- 18 effect for that purpose.
- 19 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
