## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation and administration of the professional nurse graduate education scholarship program. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding 6 Subchapter FF to read as follows: 7 SUBCHAPTER FF. PROFESSIONAL NURSE GRADUATE EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM 8 Sec. 61.9831. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: 9 (1) "Graduate professional nursing program" means an 10 11 educational program: 12 (A) of a public or private institution of higher 13 education in this state; 14 (B) that leads to a master's or doctoral degree 15 in nursing; and 16 (C) that is approved by the board or the Board of 17 Nurse Examiners. (2) "Professional nursing" has the meaning assigned by 18 Section 301.002, Occupations Code. 19 (3) "Undergraduate professional nursing program" 20 21 means an educational program: 22 (A) of a public or private institution of higher 23 education in this state; 24 (B) that prepares students for initial licensure

1 as registered nurses; and 2 (C) that is approved by the board or the Board of 3 Nurse Examiners. 4 Sec. 61.9832. SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM; AMOUNT OF SCHOLARSHIP. (a) In accordance with this subchapter and board rules, the board 5 6 shall establish and administer a program to award scholarships to students who: 7 8 (1) are enrolled in graduate professional nursing 9 programs; and (2) agree to be employed to teach in undergraduate or 10 graduate professional nursing programs for a specified period. 11 12 (b) The amount of a scholarship under this subchapter for an academic year is equal to the lesser of: 13 14 (1) \$20,000; or 15 (2) the total amount of tuition and mandatory fees that the institution that offers the graduate professional nursing 16 17 program in which the scholarship recipient is enrolled charges the recipient for that academic year for semester credit hours for 18 which the recipient may use the scholarship as provided by 19 Subsection (c). 20 21 (c) A student may use a scholarship under this subchapter only to pay tuition and mandatory fees for a semester credit hour 22 that is required for completion of the degree program in which the 23 24 student is enrolled. Sec. 61.9833. ELIGIBILITY. (a) To be eligible to receive a 25 26 scholarship under this subchapter, a person must: 27 (1) be enrolled in a graduate professional nursing

2	(2) enter into an agreement with the board as provided
3	by Section 61.9834.
4	(b) If in any year the amount of money available for
5	scholarships under this subchapter is insufficient to award a
6	scholarship to each eligible applicant or if there are more
7	eligible applicants than the number of scholarships authorized by
8	this section, the board shall establish criteria to determine which
9	eligible applicants will be granted scholarships as the board
10	determines appropriate to further the purposes of this subchapter.
11	Sec. 61.9834. AGREEMENT REQUIREMENTS. (a) To qualify for a
12	scholarship under this subchapter, a person must enter into a
13	written agreement with the board as provided by this section. The
14	agreement must:
15	(1) specify the conditions the person must satisfy to
16	receive the scholarship award in any academic year the person is
17	enrolled in the graduate professional nursing program;
18	(2) require the person to remain continuously enrolled
19	in a graduate professional nursing program;
20	(3) require the person to earn a master's or doctoral
21	degree through completion of a graduate professional nursing
22	program;
23	(4) require the person to accept, not later than the
24	first anniversary of the date the person earns a degree described by
25	Subdivision (3), an offer of full-time employment to teach in an
26	undergraduate or graduate professional nursing program;
27	(5) beginning on the date the person first becomes

employed as described by Subdivision (4), require the person to 1 2 complete five consecutive academic years of that full-time 3 employment; 4 (6) provide that any scholarship award the person 5 receives under this subchapter constitutes a loan until the person: 6 (A) subject to Section 61.9835, satisfies the 7 requirements of Subdivision (5) and any other applicable conditions 8 of the agreement; or (B) is excused from the repayment obligation in 9 accordance with law; and 10 (7) require the person to sign a promissory note 11 acknowledging the conditional nature of the scholarship award 12 received and promising to repay any unforgiven amount of that award 13 plus applicable interest and reasonable collection costs if the 14 15 person does not satisfy the applicable conditions and is not excused from the repayment obligation in accordance with law. 16 17 (b) The board shall determine the terms of the promissory note required by Subsection (a)(7). To the extent practicable, the 18 terms must be the same as those applicable to state or federally 19 guaranteed student loans made at the same time. 20 21 Sec. 61.9835. EXCEPTIONS TO SCHOLARSHIP OBLIGATIONS. (a) A person is not considered to be in violation of the continuous 22 enrollment obligations in the agreement described by Section 23 24 61.9834 if the person is unable to remain continuously enrolled in the person's degree program, remain continuously employed as 25 26 required by Section 61.9834(a)(5), or to satisfy any other condition specified by the board solely because of a hardship or 27

1	other good cause, as determined by the board, including for a reason
2	specified by Subsection (b)(2) or (3).
3	(b) A person is not considered to be in violation of the
4	employment obligation in the agreement described by Section 61.9834
5	during any period in which the person:
6	(1) is pursuing a full-time course of study:
7	(A) related to the field of professional nursing;
8	(B) offered by a public or private institution of
9	higher education in this state; and
10	(C) approved by the appropriate licensing or
11	higher education authority;
12	(2) is serving on active duty as a member of the armed
13	forces of the United States, including as a member of a reserve
14	force or National Guard called to active duty;
15	(3) is temporarily totally disabled for a period not
16	to exceed 36 months as established by the affidavit of a qualified
17	physician;
18	(4) is unable to secure employment for a period not to
19	exceed 12 months because of care required by a disabled spouse or
20	child;
21	(5) is seeking and unable to find, for a single period
22	not to exceed 12 months, full-time employment in the applicable
23	field; or
24	(6) satisfies the provisions of any other employment
25	exception adopted by the board.
26	(c) A person is excused from the repayment obligation in a
27	promissory note described by Section 61.9834 if:

1	(1) the person becomes permanently totally disabled as
2	established by the affidavit of a qualified physician; or
3	(2) the board waives repayment in the case of extreme
4	hardship to the person.
5	Sec. 61.9836. FORGIVENESS OF REPAYMENT OBLIGATION. The
6	board shall forgive 20 percent of the total amount required to be
7	repaid according to the promissory note under Section 61.9834(7)
8	for each complete academic year the person teaches in an
9	undergraduate or graduate professional nursing program in
10	accordance with the agreement under Section 61.9834 after earning a
11	degree as required by Subsection (a)(3) of that section.
12	Sec. 61.9837. GRANTS, GIFTS, AND DONATIONS. In addition to
13	money appropriated by the legislature, the board may solicit and
14	accept grants, gifts, and donations from any public or private
15	source for the purposes of this subchapter.
16	Sec. 61.9838. RULES. (a) The board shall adopt rules to
17	administer this subchapter, including rules:
18	(1) providing for the manner in which a student may
19	apply for a scholarship; and
20	(2) providing for notification of the scholarship
21	program under this subchapter to students enrolled in an
22	undergraduate or graduate professional nursing program.
23	(b) The board shall distribute a copy of the rules adopted
24	under this section to each undergraduate or graduate professional
25	nursing program.
26	Sec. 61.9839. REPORT. As part of the biennial report
27	required by Section 61.051(a-3), the board shall include

## 1 information for the preceding biennium concerning:

2 <u>(1) the number of scholarships awarded under this</u> 3 <u>subchapter;</u>

4 (2) the amount and sources of funds used to award the 5 scholarships; and

6 (3) any other program information that the board 7 determines would be helpful to the legislature.

8 SECTION 2. Not later than December 31, 2007, the Texas 9 Higher Education Coordinating Board shall adopt rules for the 10 professional nurse graduate education scholarship program under 11 Subchapter FF, Chapter 61, Education Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
