A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the licensing and regulation of residential appliance
3	installers and residential appliance installation contractors.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 1305.002, Occupations Code, is amended
6	by amending Subdivision (12-a) and adding Subdivisions (12-b),
7	(12-c), (12-d), and (12-e) to read as follows:
8	(12-a) "Residential appliance" means equipment that:
9	(A) is installed as a unit in a single-family or
10	multifamily dwelling that does not exceed four stories;
11	(B) is directly connected to an electrical
12	circuit; and
13	(C) performs a specific function ["Person" means
14	an individual].
15	(12-b) "Residential appliance installation" means
16	electrical work that is limited to the connection or disconnection
17	of a residential appliance to an existing electrical circuit other
18	than by inserting or removing a plug from an electrical outlet.
19	(12-c) "Residential appliance installation
20	contracting" means the business of residential appliance
21	installation.
22	(12-d) "Residential appliance installation
23	contractor" means a business entity, other than an electrical

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contractor or electrical sign contractor, that is engaged in

- 1 residential appliance installation contracting.
- 2 (12-e) "Residential appliance installer" means a
- 3 person, other than a <u>licensed electrician</u>, who is licensed to
- 4 perform residential appliance installation.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 1305.003(a), Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) This chapter does not apply to:
- 8 (1) the installation of electrical equipment in a
- 9 ship, watercraft other than a floating building, railway rolling
- 10 stock, aircraft, motor vehicle, or recreational vehicle;
- 11 (2) the installation of electrical equipment
- 12 underground in a mine and in self-propelled mobile surface mining
- 13 machinery and its attendant electrical trailing cable;
- 14 (3) the installation of electrical equipment for
- 15 generation, transformation, transmission, or distribution of power
- 16 used exclusively to operate railway rolling stock or exclusively
- 17 for signaling and communications purposes;
- 18 (4) the installation, maintenance, alteration, or
- 19 repair of communications equipment provided by a
- 20 telecommunications provider;
- 21 (5) the installation, maintenance, alteration, or
- 22 repair of electrical equipment under the exclusive control of an
- 23 electric utility, power generation company as defined by Sections
- 24 31.002(1) and (10), Utilities Code, electric cooperative, or
- 25 municipally owned utility and used for communications or metering,
- or for the generation, control, transformation, transmission, and
- 27 distribution of electrical energy, and located:

- 1 (A) in a building used exclusively by a utility
- 2 or power generation company for those purposes;
- 3 (B) outdoors on property owned or leased by the
- 4 utility or power generation company;
- 5 (C) on public highways, streets, roads, or other
- 6 public rights-of-way; or
- 7 (D) outdoors by established rights in vaults or
- 8 on private property;
- 9 (6) work not specifically regulated by a municipal
- ordinance that is performed in or on a dwelling by a person who owns
- 11 and resides in the dwelling;
- 12 (7) work involved in the manufacture of electrical
- 13 equipment that includes the on-site and off-site manufacturing,
- 14 commissioning, testing, calibrating, coordinating,
- 15 troubleshooting, or evaluating of electrical equipment, the
- 16 repairing or retrofitting of electrical equipment with components
- 17 of the same ampacity, and the maintenance and servicing of
- 18 electrical equipment within the equipment's enclosure that is
- 19 performed by an authorized employee of an electrical equipment
- 20 manufacturer and limited to the type of products manufactured by
- 21 the manufacturer;
- 22 (8) electrical work if:
- 23 (A) the work is performed by a person who does not
- 24 engage in electrical work for the public;
- 25 (B) the work is performed by a person regularly
- 26 employed as a maintenance person or maintenance electrician for a
- 27 business; and

- 1 (C) the electrical work does not involve the
- 2 installation of electrical equipment during new construction as
- 3 defined by rules adopted under Chapter 151, Tax Code;
- 4 (9) the installation, maintenance, alteration, or
- 5 repair of electrical equipment or associated wiring under the
- 6 exclusive control of a gas utility and used for communications or
- 7 metering or for the control, transmission, or distribution of
- 8 natural gas;
- 9 (10) thoroughfare lighting, traffic signals,
- 10 intelligent transportation systems, and telecommunications
- 11 controlled by a governmental entity;
- 12 (11) electrical connections supplying heating,
- 13 ventilation, and cooling and refrigeration equipment, including
- 14 any required disconnect exclusively for the equipment, if the
- 15 service is performed by a licensed air conditioning and
- 16 refrigeration contractor under Chapter 1302;
- 17 (12) the design, installation, erection, repair, or
- 18 alteration of Class 1, Class 2, or Class 3 remote control,
- 19 signaling, or power-limited circuits, fire alarm circuits, optical
- 20 fiber cables, or communications circuits, including raceways, as
- 21 defined by the National Electrical Code;
- 22 (13) landscape irrigation installers, as necessary to
- 23 perform the installation and maintenance of irrigation control
- 24 systems, and landscapers, as necessary to perform the installation
- 25 and maintenance of low-voltage exterior lighting and holiday
- 26 lighting excluding any required power source;
- 27 (14) electrical work performed at a business that

- 1 operates:
- 2 (A) a chemical plant, petrochemical plant,
- 3 refinery, natural gas plant, natural gas treating plant, pipeline,
- 4 or oil and gas exploration and production operation by a person who
- 5 works solely for and is employed by that business; or
- 6 (B) a chemical plant, petrochemical plant
- 7 refinery, natural gas plant, or natural gas treatment plant by a
- 8 person who under a contract of at least 12 months' duration performs
- 9 electrical work for that plant and:
- 10 (i) the electrical work is not performed
- 11 during new construction as defined by rules adopted under Chapter
- 12 151, Tax Code; or
- 13 (ii) the person is not working for a
- 14 contractor that has a principal place of business in another state
- or territory of the United States or a foreign country;
- 16 (15) the installation, maintenance, alteration, or
- 17 repair of elevators, escalators, or related equipment, excluding
- any required power source, regulated under Chapter 754, Health and
- 19 Safety Code;
- 20 (16) the installation, maintenance, alteration, or
- 21 repair of equipment or network facilities provided or utilized by a
- cable operator, as that term is defined by 47 U.S.C. Section 522, as
- 23 amended;
- 24 (17) the location, design, construction, extension,
- 25 maintenance, and installation of on-site sewage disposal systems in
- 26 accordance with Chapter 366, Health and Safety Code, or an on-site
- 27 sewage facility installer licensed under Chapter 37, Water Code;

- 1 (18) electrical work performed on a building,
- 2 structure, or equipment in agricultural use as defined by Section
- 3 11.002, Water Code, other than the processing of an agricultural
- 4 commodity;
- 5 (19) the installation, maintenance, alteration, or
- 6 repair of well pumps and equipment in accordance with Chapter 1902;
- 7 [and]
- 8 (20) electrical work required for the construction and
- 9 assembly of HUD-code manufactured housing or modular housing and
- 10 building units, other than the installation of service entrance
- 11 conductors, that is performed by a licensed manufacturer or
- 12 installer under Chapter 1201 or 1202, as applicable, if work
- 13 performed is within the scope of the license as defined by
- 14 applicable statutes and administrative rules; and
- 15 (21) the maintenance or repair of a residential
- 16 appliance by a residential appliance dealer or manufacturer or a
- person authorized by a residential appliance dealer or manufacturer
- using only components of the same type and ampacity as the original
- 19 <u>components</u>.
- SECTION 3. Section 1305.102(a), Occupations Code, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- 22 (a) The executive director shall adopt rules for the
- 23 licensing of electricians, sign electricians, electrical sign
- 24 contractors, [and] electrical contractors, residential appliance
- 25 installers, and residential appliance installation contractors as
- 26 prescribed by this chapter.
- 27 SECTION 4. Section 1305.151, Occupations Code, is amended

- 1 to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 1305.151. LICENSE REQUIRED. Except as provided by
- 3 Section 1305.003, a person or business may not perform or offer to
- 4 perform electrical work or residential appliance installation
- 5 unless the person or business holds an appropriate license issued
- 6 or recognized under this chapter.
- 7 SECTION 5. Subchapter D, Chapter 1305, Occupations Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Sections 1305.1617 and 1305.1618 to read as
- 9 follows:
- 10 Sec. 1305.1617. RESIDENTIAL APPLIANCE INSTALLER. An
- 11 applicant for a license as a residential appliance installer must
- 12 pass a residential appliance installer examination administered
- 13 under this chapter.
- 14 Sec. 1305.1618. RESIDENTIAL APPLIANCE INSTALLATION
- 15 CONTRACTOR. (a) An applicant for a license as a residential
- 16 <u>appliance installation contractor must:</u>
- 17 (1) be licensed under this chapter as a residential
- 18 appliance installer or employ a person licensed under this chapter
- 19 as a residential appliance installer;
- 20 (2) establish proof of financial responsibility in the
- 21 manner prescribed by the executive director; and
- 22 (3) maintain workers' compensation coverage for the
- 23 <u>contractor's employees through an insurance company authorized to</u>
- 24 engage in the business of insurance in this state or through
- 25 <u>self-insurance</u>, or elect not to obtain workers' compensation
- coverage, as provided by Subchapter A, Chapter 406, Labor Code.
- 27 (b) A person who holds a residential appliance installer's

- 1 license issued or recognized under this chapter may only be
- 2 assigned to a single residential appliance installation
- 3 contractor, unless the residential appliance installer owns more
- 4 than 50 percent of the residential appliance installation
- 5 contracting business.
- 6 SECTION 6. Section 1305.166(a), Occupations Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) An electrical contractor, [and] electrical sign
- 9 contractor, and residential appliance installation contractor
- 10 shall display the contractor's business name and the number of the
- 11 license issued by the executive director on each vehicle owned by
- 12 the contractor.
- 13 SECTION 7. Section 1305.201(a), Occupations Code, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 (a) This chapter does not prohibit a municipality or region
- 16 from regulating electricians or residential appliance installers
- 17 by:
- 18 (1) enacting an ordinance requiring inspections;
- 19 (2) offering examinations;
- 20 (3) issuing municipal or regional licenses; or
- 21 (4) collecting permit fees for municipal or regional
- 22 licenses and examinations from electricians and residential
- 23 <u>appliance installers</u> for work performed in the municipality or
- 24 region.
- 25 SECTION 8. (a) The Texas Department of Licensing and
- 26 Regulation shall issue a residential appliance installer license
- 27 without examination to a qualified applicant under this section

- 1 who:
- 2 (1) applies for a license under this section not later
- 3 than June 1, 2008;
- 4 (2) submits to the department information required by
- 5 rules adopted under this section;
- 6 (3) meets the experience requirement in Subsection (b)
- 7 of this section; and
- 8 (4) pays the application fee.
- 9 (b) An applicant for a license under this section is
- 10 required to have completed at least 4,000 hours of electrical work
- 11 or residential appliance installation under the supervision of a
- 12 master electrician or an owner or supervisor of a residential
- 13 appliance installation contractor.
- 14 SECTION 9. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this
- section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
- 16 (b) The change in law made by this Act by the amendment of
- 17 Section 1305.151, Occupations Code, takes effect March 1, 2008.
