H.B. No. 3075

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the transfer of course credit between public and 3 private institutions of higher education. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 61.832, Education Code, is amended to 5 6 read as follows: Sec. 61.832. COMMON COURSE NUMBERING SYSTEM. (a) The board 7 8 shall approve a common course numbering system for <u>all</u> undergraduate [lower-division] courses offered by a public or 9 private institution of higher education, other than a course that 10 is unique to an institution, to facilitate the transfer of those 11 12 courses among institutions of higher education by promoting consistency in course designation and identification. 13 14 (b) The board, with the assistance of advisory committees composed of representatives of public and private institutions of 15 higher education, shall develop as part of the common course 16 numbering system a method for determining equivalencies among 17 18 courses and assigning equivalent courses the same course number [may approve only a common course numbering system already in 19 common use in this state by institutions of higher education]. 20 21 (c) The board shall cooperate with public and private 22 institutions of higher education in any [additional] development or 23 alteration of the common course numbering system, including the taxonomy to be used, and in the development of rules for the 24

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1 administration and applicability of the system.

(d) <u>A public or private</u> [An] institution of higher education
shall include in its course listings the applicable course numbers
from the common course numbering system approved by the board under
this section. [For good cause, the board may grant to an
institution of higher education an exemption from the requirements
of this subsection.]

8 (e) An undergraduate student who transfers from one public 9 or private institution of higher education to another shall receive course credit from the receiving institution for each undergraduate 10 course that the student has successfully completed that serves as 11 12 an equivalent course under the common course numbering system at the institution from which the student transfers, subject to any 13 14 general policy of the receiving institution to deny credit for 15 courses on the basis of the number of years that have passed since the student completed the course. 16

- 17 (f) This section does not apply to a private institution of 18 higher education that:
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- does not accept any money from the state; and

20 (2) does not participate in the tuition equalization 21 grant program under Subchapter F.

SECTION 2. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies beginning with the 2009 fall semester.

(b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
develop the common course numbering system required by Section
61.832, Education Code, as amended by this Act, not later than
January 1, 2009.

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1 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 3 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 4 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 5 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
