- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

- 5 SECTION 1. Section 2054.051, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsection (g) to read as follows:
- 7 (g) The department shall establish plans and policies for
- 8 the system of telecommunications services managed and operated by
- 9 <u>the department.</u>

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- SECTION 2. Section 2054.055(b), Government Code, is amended
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 (b) The report must:
- 13 (1) assess the progress made toward meeting the goals
- 14 and objectives of the state strategic plan for information
- 15 resources management;
- 16 (2) describe major accomplishments of the state or a
- 17 specific state agency in information resources management;
- 18 (3) describe major problems in information resources
- 19 management confronting the state or a specific state agency;
- 20 (4) provide a summary of the total expenditures for
- 21 information resources and information resources technologies by
- 22 the state;
- 23 (5) make recommendations for improving the
- 24 effectiveness and cost-efficiency of the state's use of information

- 1 resources; [and]
- 2 (6) include a list compiled by the department's
- 3 program management office from the information gathered under
- 4 Sections 2055.152 and 2055.153 of the electronic government
- 5 projects:
- 6 (A) that are managed by the office under Chapter
- 7 2055; and
- 8 (B) that are not yet managed by the office under
- 9 Chapter 2055, but have been selected for management under Chapter
- 10 2055; and
- 11 (7) assess the progress made toward accomplishing the
- 12 goals of the plan for a state telecommunications network and
- 13 developing a system of telecommunications services as provided by
- 14 Subchapter H.
- SECTION 3. Section 2054.091(d), Government Code, is amended
- 16 to read as follows:
- 17 (d) The executive director shall appoint an advisory
- 18 committee to assist in the preparation of the state strategic plan.
- 19 The members of the advisory committee appointed by the executive
- 20 director must be approved by the board and must include officers or
- 21 employees of state government. [The telecommunications planning
- 22 and oversight council shall appoint one of its members to serve as a
- 23 member of the advisory committee.
- SECTION 4. Section 2054.092(b), Government Code, is amended
- 25 to read as follows:
- 26 (b) The plan must:
- 27 (1) provide a strategic direction for information

- 1 resources management in state government for the five fiscal years
- 2 following adoption of the plan;
- 3 (2) outline a state information architecture that
- 4 contains a logically consistent set of principles, policies, and
- 5 standards to guide the engineering of state government's
- 6 information technology systems and infrastructure in a way that
- 7 ensures compatibility and alignment with state government's needs;
- 8 (3) designate and report on critical electronic
- 9 government projects to be directed by the department, including a
- 10 project for electronic purchasing;
- 11 (4) provide information about best practices to assist
- 12 state agencies in adopting effective information management
- 13 methods, including the design, deployment, and management of
- 14 information resources projects, cost-benefit analyses, and staff
- 15 reengineering methods to take full advantage of technological
- 16 advancements;
- 17 (5) establish reporting guidelines for state agencies
- 18 to report in agency strategic plans:
- 19 (A) the outcomes and progress related to the
- 20 strategic direction of the state;
- 21 (B) information necessary to evaluate
- 22 opportunities for information technology consolidation;
- (C) progress toward implementing electronic
- 24 government projects designated under Subdivision (3);
- (D) the return on investment for projects and
- 26 cost-benefit models for the projects; and
- 27 (E) other provisions in this section;

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- 1 (6) provide long-range policy guidelines for
- 2 information resources in state government, including the
- 3 implementation of national, international, and department
- 4 standards for information resources technologies;
- 5 (7) identify major issues faced by state agencies
- 6 related to the acquisition of computer hardware, computer software,
- 7 and information resources technology services and develop a
- 8 statewide approach to address the issues, including:
- 9 (A) developing performance measures for
- 10 purchasing and contracting; and
- 11 (B) identifying opportunities to reuse computer
- 12 software code purchased with public funds; [and]
- 13 (8) identify priorities for:
- 14 (A) the implementation of information resources
- 15 technologies according to the relative economic and social impact
- 16 on the state; and
- 17 (B) return on investment and cost-benefit
- 18 analysis strategies; and
- 19 (9) provide information about best practices to assist
- 20 state agencies in adopting methods for design, deployment, and
- 21 management of telecommunications services.
- SECTION 5. The heading to Subchapter H, Chapter 2054,
- 23 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 24 SUBCHAPTER H. TELECOMMUNICATIONS PLANNING [AND OVERSIGHT COUNCIL]
- SECTION 6. Sections 2054.203(a), (b), and (g), Government
- 26 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 27 (a) The department [telecommunications planning and

- 1 oversight council shall comprehensively collect and manage
- 2 telecommunications network configuration information about
- 3 existing and planned telecommunications networks throughout state
- 4 government.
- 5 (b) The department [telecommunications planning and
- 6 oversight council may require state agencies to submit to the
- 7 <u>department</u> [council] the agencies' network configuration
- 8 information, but the <u>department</u> [council] must use existing reports
- 9 to gather the information if possible and minimize the reporting
- 10 burden on agencies to the extent possible.
- 11 (g) The department [telecommunications planning and
- 12 oversight council] shall perform strategic planning for all state
- 13 telecommunications services in accordance with the guiding
- 14 principles of the state strategic plan for information resources
- 15 management.
- SECTION 7. Sections 2054.204(a) and (c), Government Code,
- 17 are amended to read as follows:
- 18 (a) The department [telecommunications planning and
- 19 oversight council shall develop a plan for a state
- 20 telecommunications network that will effectively and efficiently
- 21 meet the long-term requirements of state government for voice,
- video, and computer communications, with the goal of achieving a
- 23 single centralized telecommunications network for state
- 24 government.
- 25 (c) The plan must incorporate efficiencies obtained through
- 26 the use of shared transmission services and open systems
- 27 architecture as they become available, building on existing systems

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- 1 as appropriate. To advise the department in $[\frac{1}{2}]$ developing the
- 2 plan, the executive director shall appoint an advisory committee
- 3 that consists [the telecommunications planning and oversight
- 4 council shall make use of the technical expertise] of
- 5 representatives of state agencies, including institutions of
- 6 higher education, telecommunications vendors, and customers of the
- 7 <u>state telecommunications network</u>.
- 8 SECTION 8. Section 2054.205, Government Code, is amended to
- 9 read as follows:
- Sec. 2054.205. DEVELOPMENT OF SYSTEM. (a) The <u>department</u>
- 11 [telecommunications planning and oversight council] shall develop
- 12 functional requirements for a statewide system of
- 13 telecommunications services for all state agencies. Existing
- 14 networks, as configured on September 1, 1991, of institutions of
- 15 higher education are exempt from the requirements.
- 16 (b) The <u>department</u> [telecommunications planning and
- 17 oversight council shall develop requests for information and
- 18 proposals for a statewide system of telecommunications services for
- 19 all state agencies.
- 20 SECTION 9. Sections 2054.2051(a), (b), and (c), Government
- 21 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 22 (a) The department [telecommunications planning and
- 23 oversight council shall develop service objectives for the
- 24 consolidated telecommunications system and the centralized capitol
- 25 complex telephone system.
- 26 (b) The department [telecommunications planning and
- 27 <u>oversight council</u>] shall develop performance measures to establish

- 1 cost-effective operations and staffing of the consolidated
- 2 telecommunications system and the centralized capitol complex
- 3 telephone system.
- 4 (c) The <u>department</u> [telecommunications planning and
- 5 oversight council shall review the status of all projects related
- 6 to and the financial performance of the consolidated
- 7 telecommunications system and the centralized capitol complex
- 8 telephone system, including:
- 9 (1) a comparison between actual performance and
- 10 projected goals at least once every three months; and
- 11 (2) any benefit of contracting with private vendors to
- 12 provide some or all of the systems at least once each year.
- SECTION 10. Section 2170.001(a)(1), Government Code, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 (1) "Telecommunications services" means [intercity]
- 16 communications facilities or services, including local services
- 17 provided over converged networks. The term does not include single
- 18 agency point-to-point radio systems or facilities or services of
- 19 criminal justice information communication systems.
- SECTION 11. Section 2170.002, Government Code, is amended
- 21 to read as follows:
- Sec. 2170.002. DEPARTMENT RESPONSIBLE FOR OBTAINING
- 23 TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES. (a) The department is the state agency
- 24 responsible for obtaining telecommunications services.
- 25 (b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a) of this section, Section
- 26 2170.051, or other law, a state agency may choose to procure local
- 27 services either through the department or by using any other

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authorized procurement method. A state agency is not required to
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    comply with Section 2170.051(d) in procuring such services.

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           SECTION 13. (a) The telecommunications planning
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                                                                    and
    oversight council is abolished.
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- (b) A rule, form, plan, policy, or order of the telecommunications planning and oversight council is continued in effect as a rule, form, plan, policy, or order of the Department of Information Resources until superseded by a rule or other appropriate action of the department.
- 19 SECTION 14. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
