A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the immunization requirements for admission to schools 3 and during certain declared disasters; providing a penalty. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 38.001(c), Education Code, is amended to 5 read as follows: 6 Immunization is not required for a person's admission to 7 (c) any <u>public or private</u> elementary or secondary school if the person 8 applying for admission: 9 (1) submits to the admitting official: 10 an affidavit or a certificate signed by a 11 (A) 12 physician who is duly registered and licensed to practice medicine 13 in the United States, in which it is stated that, in the physician's 14 opinion, the immunization required poses a significant risk to the health and well-being of the applicant or any member of the 15 applicant's family or household; or 16 an affidavit signed by the applicant or, if 17 (B) 18 minor, by the applicant's parent or guardian stating that the applicant declines immunization for reasons of conscience, 19 including a religious belief; or 20 21 (2) is a member of the armed forces of the United 22 States and is on active duty. SECTION 2. Section 81.009, Health and Safety Code, 23 is amended to read as follows: 24

Sec. 81.009. EXEMPTION FROM MEDICAL TREATMENT <u>OR</u>
 <u>IMMUNIZATION</u>. (a) <u>Except as provided by Subsection (c), this</u>
 [This] chapter does not authorize or require the medical treatment
 <u>or immunization</u> of an individual <u>if:</u>

5 (1) the individual or, in the case of a child, the 6 parent, managing conservator, or guardian of the child:

7 (A) objects to the medical treatment or 8 immunization for reasons of conscience; or

9 <u>(B)</u> [who] chooses treatment by prayer or 10 spiritual means; or

11 (2) the medical treatment or immunization is medically 12 contraindicated based on the opinion of a physician licensed in 13 this state or any other state who has examined the individual [as 14 part of the tenets and practices of a recognized church of which the 15 individual is an adherent or member].

16 (b) An individual who objects to medical treatment or 17 immunization [However, the individual] may be isolated or humanely 18 quarantined in an appropriate facility or at home and shall obey the 19 rules, orders, and instructions of the department or health 20 authority while in isolation or quarantine.

21 (c) [(b)] An exemption from medical treatment or 22 <u>immunization</u> under this section does not apply during <u>a public</u> 23 <u>health disaster</u> [<del>an emergency or an area quarantine or after the</del> 24 <u>issuance by the governor of an executive order or a proclamation</u> 25 <del>under Chapter 418, Government Code (Texas Disaster Act of 1975)</del>].

26 SECTION 3. Section 81.087, Health and Safety Code, is 27 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (a-1) and

1 (a-2) to read as follows:

(a) Except as provided by Subsection (a-1), a [A] person
commits an offense if the person knowingly refuses to perform or
allow the performance of certain control measures ordered by a
health authority or the department under Sections 81.083-81.086.

6 <u>(a-1) It is an exception to the application of Subsection</u> 7 <u>(a) that the individual refuses to perform or allow the performance</u> 8 <u>of a control measure based on medical or religious reasons or</u> 9 <u>reasons of conscience described by Section 81.009(a).</u>

10 <u>(a-2) A person who refuses to perform or allow the</u> 11 <u>performance of a control measure based on medical or religious</u> 12 <u>reasons or reasons of conscience described by Section 81.009(a)</u> 13 <u>commits an offense if the person refuses or fails to follow an order</u> 14 <u>by a health authority or the department for isolation or</u> 15 <u>quarantine.</u>

SECTION 4. Sections 161.0041(c), (d), and (e), Health and Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:

(c) <u>The department shall prominently post the affidavit</u> form on the department's Internet website. The department shall <u>make the affidavit form available for printing from the</u> <u>department's Internet website.</u> A person claiming an exemption from a required immunization under this section may <u>also</u> [<del>only</del>] obtain the affidavit form by submitting a written request for the affidavit form to the department.

25 (d) [The department shall develop a blank affidavit form
26 that contains a seal or other security device to prevent
27 reproduction of the form.] The affidavit form shall contain a

statement indicating that the person or, if a minor, the person's parent, managing conservator, or guardian understands the benefits and risks of immunizations and the benefits and risks of not being immunized <u>as well as instructions on how to report to the department</u> <u>incidences of discrimination based on an individual's claiming an</u> exemption from immunization.

7 (e) [The department shall maintain a record of the total 8 number of affidavit forms sent out each year and shall report that 9 information to the legislature each year.] The department may not 10 maintain a record of the names of individuals who request an 11 affidavit under this section <u>or cause the notarized exemption form</u> 12 to expire by rule.

SECTION 5. The change in law made by this Act to Section 13 81.087, Health and Safety Code, applies only to an offense 14 15 committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is covered by the 16 17 law in effect when the offense was committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, 18 an offense was committed before the effective date of this Act if 19 any element of the offense was committed before that date. 20 21 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
