H.B. No. 3132

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the authority of certain counties to impose a county
- 3 hotel occupancy tax.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 352.002, Tax Code, is amended by adding
- 6 Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 7 <u>(f) The commissioners court of a county that has a</u>
- 8 population of 150,000 or more and that is bordered by the Brazos and
- 9 Navasota Rivers may impose a tax as provided by Subsection (a).
- 10 This subsection expires September 1, 2015.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 352.003, Tax Code, is amended by adding
- 12 Subsection (h) to read as follows:
- (h) The tax rate in a county authorized to impose the tax
- 14 under Section 352.002(f) may not exceed two percent of the price
- paid for a room in a hotel. This subsection expires September 1,
- 16 2015.
- 17 SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 352, Tax Code, is amended
- 18 by adding Section 352.1034 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 352.1034. USE OF REVENUE AND RELATED ISSUES:
- 20 MID-SIZED COUNTY BORDERING BRAZOS AND NAVASOTA RIVERS. (a) This
- 21 section applies only to a county authorized to impose a tax by
- 22 Section 352.002(f).
- 23 (b) The county must spend at least 45 percent of the revenue
- 24 from the tax on marketing projects that directly promote tourism,

- 1 hotel, and convention activity.
- 2 (c) The county shall produce an annual report indicating the
- 3 tourism, hotel, and convention activity attributable to events held
- 4 <u>at facilities that receive money from the tax.</u>
- 5 (d) The county shall create an advisory committee to oversee
- 6 spending of the tax. The committee must include at least two
- 7 representatives from the hotel industry.
- 8 <u>(e) This section expires September 1, 2015.</u>
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2007.
